Joint Open Data Portal Search

- Over the past two weeks, the Department of Information Technology has added links to all MD iMAP layers to the data catalog on data.maryland.gov
- Each individual layer is shown (as opposed to each map service)
- [Data.maryland.gov](http://data.maryland.gov) now includes links to *all* of Maryland's open data – not just non-geographic data. Find all geographic and non-geographic data in one place!
- The data catalog links to MD iMAP are Socrata 'External Datasets.' Metadata and links are included on data.maryland.gov, but the data itself resides only on MD iMAP.

Imagery downloads

The State of Maryland has imagery collections available for multiple years and is committed to making these resources readily available to all users. Funding for imagery comes from the [Maryland Emergency Number Systems Board](#) and local public-safety answering points. Additional funding and support is provided by the [U.S. Geological Survey \(USGS\)](#).



MD iMAP hosts a variety of imagery collections that have been acquired since the creation of the [Maryland Statewide Imagery Program](#). Maryland imagery is available as map and image services for the most current year on the [MD iMAP Public Server](#) and preceding years on the [MD iMAP Imagery Server](#).



Download Focused Areas

The [Maryland Statewide Imagery Download Tool](#) is a web application that enables users to perform custom downloads from imagery collections. The tool provides a number of different output projections and file types. This tool is recommended when downloading focused areas of interest.



Download Pre-Defined Areas

Counties and large block areas are available for immediate download. Downloadable files include raw imagery and are available in multiple formats.

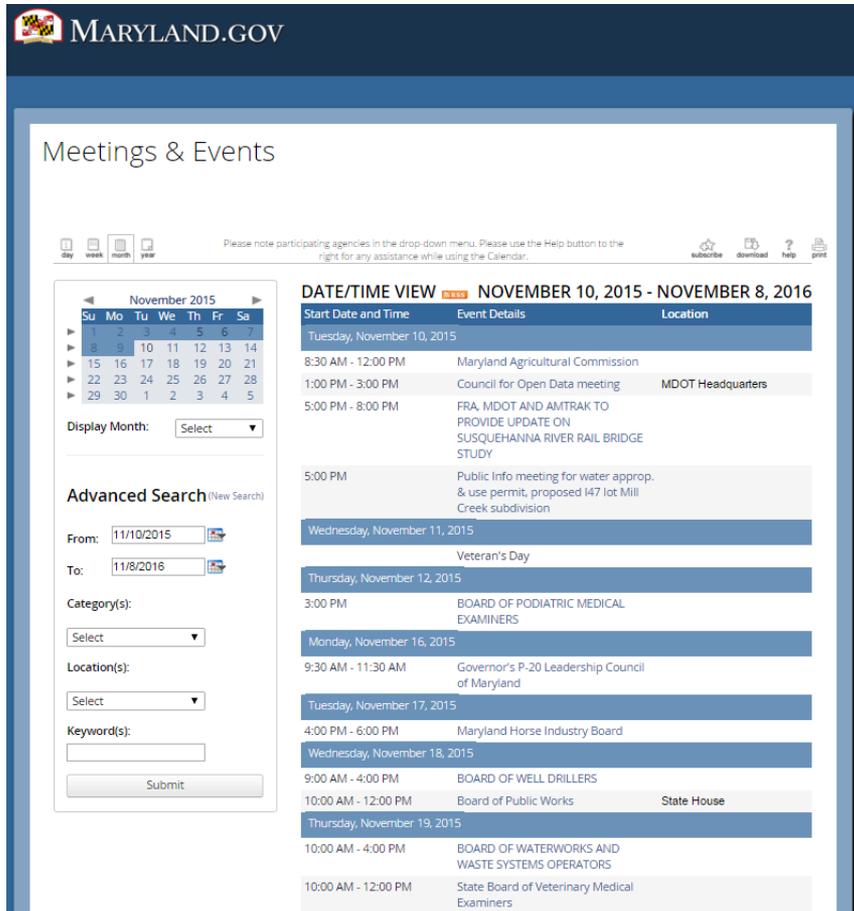
Dataset Freshness Dashboard

- Tool is going live for data.maryland.gov State users
- Solution to allow dataset owners to see whether their datasets need updating or are up-to-date

- Please check out the tool and – if needed – update your data!
- Please let other data.maryland.gov users in your agencies know about this tool
- The tool will go live to the public for the next Open Data Council meeting (i.e., in early 2016). The public version will show the agency responsible for each dataset – not the user responsible.
- Now is your chance to update your data before the public-facing version goes live!

Annual Report

- ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 10 OF EACH YEAR, THE COUNCIL SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE PREVIOUS YEAR AND ANY RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LEGISLATION.

Discussion

Council on Open Data Major Accomplishments—2015

- Maryland modified State Government Section 10-901 through 10-905, “Automated Mapping—Geographic Information Systems.”
- The Department of Information Technology (DoIT) created a joint search for Maryland’s two open data sites: MD iMAP and the Open Data Portal.
- The State Department of Assessments and Taxation (SDAT), Department of Planning (MDP), and DoIT made real property assessment records from SDAT and MDP freely available for the first time.
- State agencies published new datasets on data.maryland.gov and data.imap.maryland.gov. Agencies also created new [dashboards](#) and [maps](#) to help the public explore the data.
- DoIT launched the Dataset Freshness Dashboard to automatically find data that require updates.
- DoIT made it easier for local governments to share their public data by providing free access to [MD Geoshare](#) for publishing map data and microsites for publishing alphanumeric data.
- DoIT made it possible for citizens and firms to [download Maryland aerial imagery](#) to their own systems.
- The Secretary of State and DoIT created an [online open meetings calendar](#) and RSS data feed. These more modern interfaces supplement but do not replace the traditional Maryland Register based notifications.
- data.gov and RAMONA added all services from MD iMAP.

Council on Open Data Recommendations and Goals—2016

- The Department of Budget and Management (DBM), DoIT, and state agencies should collaborate with the Governor's Office of Performance Improvement (GOPI) to open and publish Managing for Results (MFR) data and other datasets identified by GOPI.
- GOPI should monitor agency and gubernatorial initiatives and identify opportunities to make data public.
- DoIT should develop and provide regular training sessions for agency staff on how to make data public.
- The Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention (GOCCP) and DoIT should develop a dashboard to help citizens analyze crime data by county.
- DBM and DoIT should publish Maryland's Operating Budget as open data and develop an interactive dashboard to help citizens explore budget data.
- DoIT should incorporate a statewide dataset inventory into Maryland's Information Technology Management Plan.
- DoIT, with input from the council, should report on the costs and benefits of a potential statewide Public Information Act (PIA) tracking database.
- DoIT, with input from the council, should evaluate open source alternatives to Maryland's current open data portals.
- The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) and DoIT should leverage new provisions of the PIA to encourage agencies to identify additional datasets for publication as open data.
- DoIT should make full address points and LIDAR imagery available to the public on the open data portals.
