Review Minutes from 6/5/2025– Brandon Renehan

Proposed New Limited-Primary User

Harford County, MD, represented by Randy Cunningham/Division Chief – Harford County Emergency Services

Harford County is requesting 8-10 dedicated backup talkgroups as part of their PACE plan, for use should Harford County P25 public safety radio system become inoperable, and for training. Use would occur on the rare occasion public safety users need to operate outside of the Harford County system coverage footprint.

Harford County Public Safety includes the following agencies: Harford County Emergency Services, Harford County Sheriff's Office, City of Aberdeen Police, Town of Bel Air Police, City of Havre de Grace Police, and Harford County Volunteer Fire and EMS Association.

They currently have ~3500 radios activated on MD FIRST. All radios accessing these resources would be TDMA capable. They intend to integrate into the County's dispatch consoles via consolettes/CCGWs/base stations, which is similar to the current use with MD CALL / MD EVENT / MD AV / MD PSAP resources.

Expected Capacity Impact: Minimal during day-to-day, acceptable impact when needed as emergency backup

**2 Channel expansion project for Harford County already in the works*

The System Managers' Committee recommends the Radio Control Board approve Harford County, MD's application to become a Limited-Primary User on MD FIRST.

Proposed New Limited-Primary User

Charles County, MD, represented by Jeffrey Clements/Chief 9-1-1 Communications

Charles County is requesting 8 dedicated backup talkgroups for use in the event of a catastrophic failure of their current aging 4.1 radio system. The current system is 20+ years old, and the county has issues with availability of replacement parts. The new system is under construction and is projected to cutover in Jan '27. Charles County will keep these talkgroups available with the new system for backup.

Charles County currently has ~2000 radios that could potentially use these talkgroups. All radios accessing MD FIRST would be TDMA capable. They intend to integrate into the County's dispatch consoles via consolettes/CCGWs/base stations.

Expected Capacity Impact: Minimal during day-to-day, and acceptable impact when needed as emergency backup.

Charles County cell current usage is relatively low (~10% utilization during busy hour).

The System Managers' Committee recommends the Radio Control Board approve Charles County, MD's application to become a Limited-Primary User on MD FIRST.

Project Status Update – Curt Andrich

Curt presented an update on coverage improvements. T1 to Ethernet conversion is almost complete; acceptance testing will continue through the second week of September. Some of the improvements and major impacts to the system are as follows: new equipment is more redundant, uses less space/power, and allows easier channel expansion. Increased channel capacity in Harford, Howard, and Anne Arundel Counties is underway with Motorola.

Operations and Maintenance Status Update – Brandon Renehan

Brandon presented an update on the operations and maintenance of the system. The A2024 upgrade status is more than halfway complete. Zones 1 and 3 are complete. Zone 5 upgrades will start 9/15/25. Other upgrades in process: Core Server, RF Site Software, Console Sites, and Ancillary Systems (Nice/Genesis/etc.).

Before/After testing has been done, and antenna adjustments have been performed on the Fairview antenna. Brandon noted an average signal strength improvement of over 4dBm and 1.2% improvement in Bit Error Rate. More testing will continue in areas of Washington and Frederick Counties. MD FiRST Team reminded user community to provide as much information as possible when sending in reports of poor coverage. Users are requested to use the MD FiRST coverage report by using this [link](#)

Austin Pencinger (Amtrak PD) reported that RF coverage may be affected on new commuter Amtrak trains which have single-pane metallic glaze on the windows.

New Features – Brandon Renehan

- MD FiRST and Network MD are working together to bring MD FiRST Radio Management Wi-Fi programming to State buildings that are connected via SwGi.
- The Genesis Provisioning Manager Interface Enhancement is expected Q4.
- The MD FiRST Help Desk is planned to go live to Users 12/2025.
