#### Review of the Annual Report Draft

Patrick Mulford and Sara Elalamy summarized the draft annual report prepared over the holiday season, which includes recommendations for IT and cybersecurity improvements.

#### **Key Points from the Report:**

- Cover letter addressed to the Governor, presiding officers, and committee heads.
- Overview of the MMC's legislative mandate.
- 12 key recommendations for IT strategy and cybersecurity.
- Recognition of the Department of IT's (DoIT) growth under Secretary Savage and the Moore-Miller administration.

### Discussion on Recommendations:

# Recommendation 1: Promoting Diversity and Inclusion in IT Hiring & Procurement

- Ensuring best practices in hiring and procurement policies.
- Collaboration with the Office of State Procurement and DGS to institutionalize DEI efforts.
- Clarifications needed on how DEI applies to procurement processes.

#### Recommendation 2: IT Resource Consolidation & Optimization

- Ensuring DoIT and the IT Council (ITC) develop a feedback mechanism for service improvement.
- Enhancing transparency by publicizing IT service offerings.
- Developing a user-friendly MITDP dashboard to track spending and project progress.

### **Recommendation 3: Cybersecurity Measures & MFA Implementation**

- Focus on increasing cybersecurity visibility and standardization across agencies.
- Discussion on the feasibility of implementing multi-factor authentication (MFA) for local governments.
- Greg Rogers (DoIT) emphasized that MFA implementation should focus on feasibility rather than conducting another study.

#### **Recommendation 4: Network Infrastructure Consolidation**

- Renewed focus on maintaining an up-to-date inventory of state IT and broadband infrastructure.
- Acknowledgment that past efforts to centralize this data had lost momentum.
- Debate over whether a new working group is necessary or if the ITC can handle this task.

## **Recommendation 5: IT Procurement Process & Threshold Adjustments**

- Proposal to increase the IT procurement approval threshold by the Board of Public Works (BPW).
- Suggestion to introduce an automatic adjustment based on inflation to avoid frequent revisions.
- Difficulty in engaging the Office of State Procurement for feedback on this issue.

#### 3. Additional Discussion Points

- Concern over the scope of MMC recommendations and ensuring clarity in target audiences.
- The need for more stakeholder input before some recommendations move forward.
- Discussion on the feasibility and value of cyber insurance policies for the state.

### 4. Next Steps & Closing Remarks

- Patrick Mulford (DoIT) and Sara Elalamy (DoIT) will finalize the draft report over the next few days.
- The final draft will be distributed for review and potential online voting to expedite submission.

#### **Action Items:**

- Members to review and provide any additional comments.
- Consider scheduling a follow-up meeting or online vote for final approval.
