Ladies/Gentlemen:

This Amendment #1 is being issued to amend and clarify certain information contained in the above referenced RFP. All information contained herein is binding on all Offerors who respond to this RFP. Specific parts of the RFP have been amended. The following changes/additions are listed below; new language has been double underlined and marked in bold (i.e., **word**) and language deleted has been marked with a strikethrough (i.e., ~~word~~).

1. Revise the Key Information Summary Sheet (p.2) as follows:

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2. Revise Section 3.7.6 – Labor Categories on (p. 33) as follows:

3.7.6.1 ~~Facilities Specialist I~~ **Inside/Outside Plant Technician I**

Duties: Performs installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of facilities, institutional equipment and systems. **Performs necessary tasks to access, install, remove and/or test cooper or fiber optic cable aerially or under the ground, install, repair and maintain hand-holes and underground conduit.** This may include, but is not limited to ~~high and low pressure steam plant boilers; security and fire systems; portable and installed generator sets, automatic transfer sets, ancillary power distribution systems, and uninterruptable power supplies, batteries and associated electrical wiring/components; air handling units, pumps, exchangers and cooling towers; and, carpentry, painting, plumbing, electrical and mechanical activities.~~ May perform various mechanical functions associated with diagnostics, dismantling, and repair of machines and mechanical equipment.

Education: High School diploma or equivalent required.

General Experience: This position typically requires one (1) year of related experience in facilities work or related field **in inside or outside plant work.**

### 3.7.6.2 Facilities-Specialist II Inside/Outside Plant Technician II

Duties: Performs installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of facilities, institutional equipment and systems. Performs necessary tasks to access, install, remove and/or test cooper or fiber optic cable aeriully or under the ground, install, repair and maintain hand-holes and underground conduit. This may include, but is not limited to high and low pressure steam plant boilers; security and fire systems; portable and installed generator sets, automatic transfer sets, ancillary power distribution systems, and uninterruptable power supplies, batteries and associated electrical wiring/components; air handling units, pumps, exchangers and cooling towers; and, carpentry, painting, plumbing, electrical and mechanical activities. May perform various mechanical functions associated with diagnostics, dismantling, and repair of machines and mechanical equipment.

Education: High School diploma or equivalent required.

General Experience: This position typically requires two (2) years of related experience in facilities work or related field in inside or outside plant work.

### 3.7.6.3 Facilities-Specialist III Inside/Outside Plant Technician III

Duties: Performs installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of facilities, institutional equipment and systems. Performs necessary tasks to access, install, remove and/or test cooper or fiber optic cable aeriully or under the ground, install, repair and maintain hand-holes and underground conduit. This may include, but is not limited to high and low pressure steam plant boilers; security and fire systems; portable and installed generator sets, automatic transfer sets, ancillary power distribution systems, and uninterruptable power supplies, batteries and associated electrical wiring/components; air handling units, pumps, exchangers and cooling towers; and, carpentry, painting, plumbing, electrical and mechanical activities. May perform various mechanical functions associated with diagnostics, dismantling, and repair of machines and mechanical equipment.

Education: High School diploma or equivalent required.

General Experience: This position typically requires five (5) years of related experience in facilities work or related field in inside or outside plant work.

### 3.7.6.4 Facilities-Specialist Lead Inside/Outside Plant Lead

Duties: Oversees and directs daily activities involving the installation, operation, maintenance, and repair of facilities, institutional equipment and systems inside and

**outside fiber optic cables. Oversees the necessary tasks to access, install, remove and/or test cooper or fiber optic cable aerially or under the ground, install, repair and maintain hand-holes and underground conduit.** This may include, but is not limited to high and low pressure steam plant boilers; security and fire systems; portable and installed generator sets, automatic transfer sets, and uninterruptable power supplies; batteries and associated electrical wiring/components; air handling units, pumps, exchangers and cooling towers; and, carpentry, painting, plumbing, electrical and mechanical activities. May perform various mechanical functions associated with diagnostics, dismantling, and repair of machines and mechanical equipment.

Education: High School diploma or equivalent, and knowledge of OSHA general safety standards related to work involving electrical and mechanical tasks in an industrial environment.

General Experience: This position typically requires eight (8) years of experience in facilities work, **inside and outside cabling, or** related field.

#### 3.7.6.5 Geographic Information Systems Specialist

~~Duties: Conducts geographic information system (GIS) program activities, utilizing GIS hardware and software to produce maps, spatial databases and thematic data (such as wetlands, road centerlines, cadastre, and historic sites). Creates, adjusts, corrects, converts and distributes base maps and thematic data. Digitize and maintain spatial databases of Maryland information; document procedures, validate data for accuracy and completeness, complete approved metadata forms and produce maps of the resulting information. Evaluate information and data from outside sources to determine the quality of the data. Provide geographic location coordinates from the GIS to facilitate spatial analysis and data manipulation, calculate distances and area of features and interpret legal descriptions and certify changes in boundary lines. Act as a "consultant" to internal customers during their use, development and quality assessment of spatial databases.~~

~~Education: 1) A Bachelor's Degree from an accredited college or university in Geography, GIS Technology, Cartography, Computer Science, or related field with at least nine (9) credit hours in courses specifically related to GIS operation/management.~~

~~Experience: Two (2) years of professional experience is required in GIS, cartography, CADD, or a related field without the appropriate college degree.~~

#### 3.7.6.8 Geographic Information Systems Technician Trainee

~~Duties: Conducts geographic information system (GIS) program activities, utilizing GIS hardware and software to produce maps, spatial databases and thematic data (such as wetlands, road centerlines, cadastre, and historic sites). Creates, adjusts, corrects, converts and distributes base maps and thematic data. Digitize and maintain spatial databases of Maryland information; document procedures, validate data for accuracy and~~

~~completeness, complete approved metadata forms and produce maps of the resulting information. Evaluate information and data from outside sources to determine the quality of the data. Provide geographic location coordinates from the GIS to facilitate spatial analysis and data manipulation, calculate distances and area of features and interpret legal descriptions and certifies changes in boundary lines.~~

~~Education: A high school diploma or equivalent.~~

~~Experience: One (1) year of professional experience related to GIS, cartography, CADD, or a related field~~

3. Revise Section 7 –Limitations of Liability (p.60) as follows:

7.1. Contractor shall be liable for any loss or damage to the State occasioned by the acts or omissions of Contractor, its subcontractors, agents or employees, including but not limited to personal injury; physical loss; or violations of the Patents, Copyrights, Intellectual Property sections of this Contract, as follows:

7.1.1. For infringement of patents, trademarks, trade secrets and copyrights as provided in Section 5 (“Patents, Copyrights, Intellectual Property”) of this Contract;

7.1.2. Without limitation for damages for bodily injury (including death) and damage to real property and tangible personal property; and

7.1.3. ~~For all other claims, damages, loss, costs, expenses, suits or actions in any way related to this Contract where liability is not otherwise set forth as being “without limitation,” and regardless of the basis on which the claim is made, Contractor’s liability shall not exceed 5 times the value of the Contract. Third party claims arising under Section 6 (“Indemnification”) of this Contract are included in this limitation of liability only if the State is immune from liability. Contractor’s liability for third party claims arising under Section 6 of this Contract shall be unlimited if the State is not immune from liability for claims arising under Section 6.~~

**For all other claims, damages, loss, costs, expenses, suits or actions in any way related to this Contract, regardless of the form, Contractor’s liability per claim shall not exceed five (5) times the total amount of the TORFP out of which the claim arises; provided however, the State may, in its sole discretion, decrease the ceiling established hereunder in any TORFP issued pursuant to this RFP. Third-party claims arising under Section 6 (“Indemnification”) of this Contract are included in this limitation of liability only if the State is immune from liability. Contractor’s liability for third-party claims arising under Section 6 of this Contract shall be unlimited if the State is not immune from liability for claims arising under Section 6**



- 7.1.4. In no event shall the existence of a subcontract operate to release or reduce the liability of Contractor hereunder. For purposes of this Contract, Contractor agrees that it is responsible for performance of the services and compliance with the relevant obligations hereunder by its Subcontractors.
- 7.1.5 In no event shall Contractor, its subsidiaries or subcontractors, or their respective personnel, be liable to the State for any consequential, special, indirect, incidental, punitive, or exemplary damages relating to this Contract, except (i) to the extent resulting from the recklessness, bad faith or intentional misconduct of Contractor or its subcontractors and (2) as set forth in Sections 5 and 6 of this Contract.
