IT Procurement Reform Goals

- Short-term: update terms and conditions of particular issue for business partners
- Intermediate: Improve speed to market and establish standard procurement templates that are largely complete
- Long-term: support public/private partnerships, for example California's CalCloud model
- Award additional master contracts to ease the procurement burden for agencies and DoIT

Objectives/Goals

- Doing business with the State
- Promote innovative technology solutions to State's needs
- Increase Minority Business Enterprise (MBE), Small Business Enterprise (SBE), Veteran Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) access to State procurements
- Expedite procurement process ("speed to market")
- Standardize contract language
- Remove the "one size fits all" approach to IT contracts






What type of IT does your company primarily provide?




How many IT services/products contracts has your company provided to the State of MD?









Does your company (or will offer within 12 months) a cloud-based service (including SaaS)?



The State has started using request for information (RFI) as a means of gathering information in advance of writing a solicitation. Does your company:


- 1) Strongly favor this approach



Actions

- Draft and implement first standard IT contract Q2-Q4 2014
 Standardize Statewide IT Ts & Cs
 - Reduce negotiation time by identifying non-negotiable Ts & Cs
- Recommend initial regulatory/statutory amendments Q4 2014
 - Recommend updates to COMAR, possible legislation to create ITspecific terms and conditions
- Publish IT Templates Q3 2014 (complete on 9/30/14)
 - Publish DoIT RFP and IFB templates, updated CATS+ TORFP template
- Begin review and revision of standard IT contract with SaaS
 Ts & Cs Q2 2015
 - Incrementally analyze targeted terms for best value to State and vendor community
