Amendment #1 RFP

Ladies/Gentlemen:

Amendment #1 is being issued to amend and clarify certain information contained in the above referenced RFP. All information contained herein is binding on all Offerors who respond to this RFP. Specific parts of the RFP have been amended. The following changes/additions are listed below; new language has been double underlined and marked in bold (i.e., <u>word</u>) and language deleted has been marked with a strikeout (i.e., <u>word</u>).

1. Revise the language of Attachment M of the RFP as follows:

18.19. Nonvisual Accessibility Warranty Reserved

- 18.19.1. The Contractor warrants that the information technology to be provided under the Contract.
- (a) provides equivalent access for effective use by both visual and non-visual means;
- (b) will present information, including prompts used for interactive communications, in formats intended for both visual and non-visual use;
- (c) if intended for use in a network, can be integrated into networks for obtaining, retrieving, and disseminating information used by individuals who are not blind or visually impaired; and
- (d) is available, whenever possible, without modification for compatibility with Software and hardware for non-visual access.

18.19.2. The Contractor further warrants that the cost, if any, of modifying the information technology for compatibility with Software and hardware used for non-visual access does not increase the cost of the information technology by more than five percent. For purposes of this Contract, the phrase "equivalent access" means the ability to receive, use and manipulate information and operate controls necessary to access and use information technology by non-visual means. Examples of equivalent access include



keyboard controls used for input and synthesized speech, Braille, or other audible or tactile means used for output.

2. Revise the language of Sections 2.14.10 and 2.14.11 of the RFP as follows:

2.14.10 and 2.14.11 Wireless Systems Technician & Junior Wireless Systems Technician

Duties: These are the journey (Technician), and experienced (Junior Technician) levels of technical support work installing, repairing, maintaining, programming and modifying wireless communications components, devices and equipment such as, but not limited to, digital microwaves, base stations, portable radios, wireless transmitters and receivers, and two way mobile communication systems. Employees at these levels do not supervise other employees. These are the journey (Technician), and experienced (Junior Technician) levels of technical support work installing, repairing, maintaining, programming and modifying communications components, devices and equipment such as, but not limited to, digital microwaves, base stations, portable radios, transmitters and receivers, and two-way mobile communication systems. Employees at these levels do not supervise other employees.

Education and other Requirements: Graduation from a standard high school or possession of a high school equivalency certificate.

General Experience: Technician - Two years of experience installing, repairing, maintaining, programming and modifying devices and equipment associated wireless communication technologies and networks. Two years of experience installing, repairing, maintaining, programming and modifying communication and network devices and equipment. Junior Technician - One year experience repairing microprocessor digital electronic systems. One year of experience installing, repairing, maintaining, programming and modifying communication and network devices and equipment.
