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# 1 GENERAL INFORMATION

## 1.1 Summary Statement

- 1.1.1 The Department of Information Technology (DoIT or “the Department”) is issuing this Request for Proposals (RFP) to award one statewide contract to procure toll free and associated enhancement services.
- 1.1.2 It is the State’s intention to obtain products/services, as specified in this RFP, through a Contract between the successful Offeror and the State. See Section 1.4 for contract duration information.
- 1.1.3 The Department intends to make a single award as a result of this RFP.
- 1.1.4 Offerors, either directly or through their Subcontractor(s), must be able to provide all products/services and meet all of the requirements requested in this solicitation and the successful Offeror (the Contractor) shall remain responsible for Contract performance regardless of Subcontractor participation in the work.
- 1.1.5 The resulting Contract applies exclusively to all entities of State of Maryland government subject to Section 3A-302(b) of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

### 1.3 Contract Type

The Contract that results from this RFP shall be a Fixed-Unit Price, Indefinite Quantity Contract as defined in COMAR 21.06.03.02 and 21.06.03.06.

### 1.4 Contract Duration

1.4.1 The Contract shall start from the date of mutual contract execution by the parties.

- 1.4.2 As of the NTP Date contained in a Notice to Proceed (NTP), the Contractor shall perform all activities required by the Contract, including the requirements of this solicitation and the offerings in its Technical Proposal, for the compensation described in its Financial Proposal.
- 1.4.3 The Contract resulting from this RFP shall be for three (3) initial years from Contract start date. The State, at its sole option, may renew the term of the Contract through two (2) additional one-year renewal options for up to a total potential Contract length of five (5) years plus one (1) additional transition period, on a month to month basis, not to exceed six (6) months.
- 1.4.4 The Contractor's obligations to pay invoices to subcontractors that provide products/services during the Contract term, as well as the audit, confidentiality, document retention, and indemnification obligations of the Contract (see Attachment A), shall survive expiration or termination of the Contract and continue in effect until all such obligations are satisfied.

### **1.5 Procurement Officer**

The sole point of contact in the State for purposes of this RFP prior to the award of a contract is the Procurement Officer as listed Key Information Summary Sheet.

DoIT may change the Procurement Officer at any time by written notice.

### **1.6 Contract Manager**

The DoIT Contract Manager for the Contract is listed in the Key Information Summary Sheet.

DoIT may change the Contract Manager at any time by written notice.

### **1.7 Pre-proposal Conference**

- 1.7.1 A pre-proposal conference will be held at the time, date and location indicated on the Key Information Summary Sheet. Attendance at the pre-proposal conference is not mandatory, but all interested companies are encouraged to attend in order to facilitate better preparation of their proposals.
- 1.7.2 Seating at the pre-proposal conference will be limited to two (2) attendees per company. Attendees should bring a copy of the solicitation and a business card to help facilitate the sign-in process.
- 1.7.3 The pre-proposal conference will be summarized in writing. As promptly as is feasible subsequent to the pre-proposal conference, the attendance record and pre-proposal summary will be distributed via the same mechanism described for amendments and questions.
- 1.7.4 In order to assure adequate seating and other accommodations at the pre-proposal conference, please e-mail the Pre-Proposal Conference Response Form (Attachment E) no later than the time and date indicated on the form. In addition, if there is a need for sign language interpretation and/or other special accommodations due to a disability, please call the Procurement Officer no later than five (5) business days prior to the pre-proposal conference. The Department will make reasonable efforts to provide such special accommodation.

**1.8 eMaryland Marketplace (eMM)**

- 1.8.1 eMaryland Marketplace (eMM) is an electronic commerce system administered by the Maryland Department of General Services (DGS). In addition to using the DoIT's website <http://doit.maryland.gov/contracts/Pages/bids.aspx> and possibly using other means for transmitting the RFP and associated materials, the RFP, pre-proposal conference summary and attendance sheet, Offerors' questions and the Procurement Officer's responses, addenda, and other solicitation related information will be made available via eMM.
- 1.8.2 In order to receive a contract award, a company must be registered on eMM. Guidelines can be found on the eMaryland Marketplace website at <http://emaryland.buyspeed.com>.

**1.9 Questions**

- 1.9.1 All questions shall be submitted via e-mail to the Procurement Officer no later than the date and time indicated in the Key Information Summary Sheet. Please identify in the subject line the Solicitation Number and Title. Answers to all questions that are not clearly specific only to the requestor will be distributed via the same mechanism as for RFP amendments and posted on eMM.
- 1.9.2 Only answers that have been answered in writing by the State can be considered final and binding.

**1.10 Procurement Method**

The Contract will be awarded in accordance with the Competitive Sealed Proposals procurement method as described in COMAR 21.05.03.

**1.11 Proposals Due (Closing) Date and Time**

- 1.11.1 Proposals, in the number and form set forth in Section 4 "Proposal Format," must be received by the Procurement Officer no later than the date and time listed on the Key Information Summary Sheet in order to be considered.
- 1.11.2 Requests for extension of this date or time shall not be granted. Offerors mailing Proposals should allow sufficient mail delivery time to ensure timely receipt by the Procurement Officer. Except as provided in COMAR 21.05.02.10, Proposals received by the Procurement Officer after the due date and time shall not be considered.
- 1.11.3 Proposals may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received by the Procurement Officer before the Proposals due time and date.
- 1.11.4 Proposals delivered by e-mail or facsimile shall not be considered.
- 1.11.5 Companies not responding to this solicitation are requested to submit the "Notice to Offerors/Bidders/Contractors" form, which includes company information and the reason for not responding (e.g., too busy, cannot meet mandatory requirements).

**1.12 Multiple or Alternate Proposals**

Multiple and/or alternate Proposals will not be accepted.

**1.13 Economy of Preparation**

Proposals should be prepared simply and economically and provide a straightforward and concise description of the Offeror's Proposal to meet the requirements of this RFP.

**1.14 Public Information Act Notice**

- 1.14.1 Offerors should give specific attention to the clear identification of those portions of their proposals that they deem to be confidential, proprietary commercial information or trade secrets and provide justification why such materials, upon request, should not be disclosed by the State under the Public Information Act, General Provisions Article, Title 4, Md. Code Ann.,. (Also, see RFP Section 4.2.2.2 "Claim of Confidentiality"). This confidential and/or proprietary information should be identified by page and section number and placed after the Title Page and before the Table of Contents in the Technical Proposal and if applicable, separately in the Financial Proposal.
- 1.14.2 Offerors are advised that, upon request for this information from a third party, the Procurement Officer is required to make an independent determination whether the information must be disclosed.

**1.15 Award Basis**

A Contract shall be awarded to the responsible Offeror submitting the Proposal that has been determined to be the most advantageous to the State, considering price and evaluation factors set forth in this RFP (see COMAR 21.05.03.03F), for providing the products/services as specified in this RFP. See RFP Section 5 for further award information.

**1.16 Oral Presentation**

Offerors determined to be reasonably susceptible may be required to make oral presentations to State representatives. Offerors must confirm in writing any substantive oral clarification of, or change in, their Proposals made in the course of discussions. Any such written clarifications or changes then become part of the Offeror's Proposal and are binding if the Contract is awarded. The Procurement Officer will notify Offerors of the time and place of oral presentations.

**1.17 Duration of Proposal**

Proposals submitted in response to this RFP are irrevocable for the latest of the following: 180 days following the closing date for submission of proposals, best and final offers (if requested), or the date any protest concerning this RFP is finally resolved. This period may be extended at the Procurement Officer's request only with the Offeror's written agreement.

**1.18 Revisions to the RFP**

- 1.18.1 If it becomes necessary to revise this RFP before the due date for Proposals, the Department shall endeavor to provide addenda to all prospective Offerors that were sent this RFP or which are otherwise known by the Procurement Officer to have obtained this RFP. In addition, addenda to the RFP will be posted on the Department's procurement web page and through eMM. It remains the responsibility of all prospective Offerors to check all applicable websites

for any addenda issued prior to the submission of Proposals. Addenda made after the due date for Proposals will be sent only to those Offerors that submitted a timely Proposal and that remain under award consideration as of the issuance date of the addenda.

- 1.18.2 Acknowledgment of the receipt of all addenda to this RFP issued before the Proposal due date shall be included in the Transmittal Letter accompanying the Offeror's Technical Proposal. Acknowledgement of the receipt of addenda to the RFP issued after the Proposal due date shall be in the manner specified in the addendum notice. Failure to acknowledge receipt of an addendum does not relieve the Offeror from complying with the terms, additions, deletions, or corrections set forth in the addendum, and may cause the Proposal to be deemed not susceptible for award.

### **1.19 Cancellations**

The State reserves the right to cancel this RFP, accept or reject any and all Proposals, in whole or in part, received in response to this RFP, to waive or permit the cure of minor irregularities, and to conduct discussions with all qualified or potentially qualified Offerors in any manner necessary to serve the best interests of the State. The State also reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to award a Contract based upon the written Proposals received without discussions or negotiations.

### **1.20 Incurred Expenses**

The State will not be responsible for any costs incurred by any Offeror in preparing and submitting a Proposal, in making an oral presentation, in providing a demonstration, or in performing any other activities related to submitting a Proposal in response to this solicitation.

### **1.21 Protest/Disputes**

Any protest or dispute related, respectively, to this solicitation or the Contract shall be subject to the provisions of COMAR 21.10 (Administrative and Civil Remedies).

### **1.22 Offeror Responsibilities**

- 1.22.1 The successful Offeror shall be responsible for rendering products and services for which it has been selected as required by this RFP. All subcontractors shall be identified and a complete description of their role relative to the Proposal shall be included in the Offeror's Proposal. If applicable, subcontractors utilized in meeting the established MBE or VSBE participation goal(s) for this solicitation shall be identified as provided in the appropriate Attachment(s) of this RFP (see Section 1.33 "Minority Business Enterprise Goals" and Section 1.41 "Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise Goals").
- 1.22.2 If an Offeror that seeks to perform or provide the products/services required by this RFP is the subsidiary of another entity, all information submitted by the Offeror, such as but not limited to, references, financial reports, or experience and documentation (e.g. insurance policies, bonds, letters of credit) used to meet minimum qualifications, if any, shall pertain exclusively to the Offeror, unless the parent organization will guarantee the performance of the subsidiary. If applicable, the Offeror's Proposal shall contain an explicit statement that the parent organization will guarantee the performance of the subsidiary.

1.22.3 Although experience and documentation of an Offeror's parent may be used to satisfy minimum qualifications, a parental guarantee of the performance of the Offeror under this Section will not automatically result in crediting the Offeror with the experience and/or qualifications of the parent under any evaluation criteria pertaining to the actual Offeror's experience and qualifications. Instead, the Offeror will be evaluated on the extent to which the State determines that the experience and qualifications of the parent are transferred to and shared with the Offeror, any stated intent by the parent in its guarantee of performance for direct involvement in the performance of the Contract, and the value of the parent's participation as determined by the State.

### 1.23 Substitution of Contractor Personnel

#### A. Key Personnel

For this Contract, the following positions to be identified in the Technical Proposal will be considered Key Personnel, and shall be required to perform the activities below.

1. **Contract Administrator** - Serves as the central point of contact on behalf of the Contractor. Responsibilities of this function include, but are not limited to:
  - a) Acts as liaison between the Contractor staff and the State on all contract, service order and repair related matters,
  - b) Oversees orders received from the State ensuring that the requirements of the service order fulfillment process in Section 3.5 are met,
  - c) Has the authority to commit the Contractor's staff and provide any necessary remediation plans,
  - d) Chairs a monthly service meeting between the Contractor and the Contract Manager.
2. **Transition Project Manager** – Serves as the single point of contact for the transition-in process, answering questions and resolving issues during the transition-in period (See section 3.3.4). Responsibilities of this function include, but are not limited to:
  - a) Ensures only valid accounts are assigned to the resulting Contract,
  - b) Creates procedures to transfer valid accounts to the resulting Contract,
  - c) Renames all new and transitioned accounts to follow the naming convention defined in Section 3.3.4.4.a.(Transition-In Requirements)
  - d) Oversees the creation of the inventory report during the transition period.
3. **Billing Administrator** – Serves as the single point of contact for all billing questions and issues. Responsibilities of this function include, but are not limited to:
  - a) Promptly answers billing questions, researching and correcting billing issues and problems,
  - b) Ensures all valid accounts are associated with the Contract, and that all accounts associated with the Contract are valid State accounts,
  - c) Maintains the naming convention for all State of Maryland accounts,
  - d) Provides knowledge and expertise regarding any billing question,
  - e) Provides inventory report after transition period complete,

f) Provides capability to perform audit of services (see Section 3.3.13).

4. **Service Manager** – Serves as the single point of contact and first point of escalation for the State during major, chronic and critical outages. Service Manager also serves as a technical resource to the State.

B. Continuous Performance of Key Personnel

Key Personnel shall be available to perform Contract requirements 30 days from the NTP Date. Unless explicitly authorized by the Contract Manager or specified in the Contract, Key Personnel shall be assigned to the State of Maryland as a dedicated resource.

Key personnel shall perform continuously for the duration of the Contract, or such lesser duration as specified in the Technical Proposal. Key Personnel may not be removed by the Contractor from working under the Contract without the prior written approval of the Contract Manager.

C. Definitions

For the purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:

1. **Extraordinary Personnel Event** – means leave under the Family Medical Leave Act; or an incapacitating injury or incapacitating illness; or other circumstances that in the sole discretion of the State warrant an extended leave of absence, such as extended jury duty or extended military service that precludes the individual from performing his/her job duties under the Contract.
2. **Incapacitating** – means any health circumstance that substantially impairs the ability of an individual to perform the job duties described for that individual's position in the RFP or the Contractor's Technical Proposal.

D. Contractor Personnel General Substitution Provisions

The following provisions apply to all of the circumstances of Contractor Personnel substitution described in paragraph E of this section.

1. The Contractor shall demonstrate to the Contract Manager's satisfaction that the proposed substitute has qualifications at least equal to those of the Contractor Personnel proposed to be replaced.
2. The Contractor shall provide the Contract Manager with a substitution request that shall include:
  - a. A detailed explanation of the reason(s) for the substitution request;
  - b. The resume of the proposed substitute, signed by the substituting individual and his/her formal supervisor;
  - c. The official resume of the current personnel for comparison purposes; and
  - d. Evidence of any required credentials.
3. The Contract Manager may request additional information concerning the proposed substitution. In addition, the Contract Manager and/or other appropriate State personnel involved with the Contract may interview the proposed substitute personnel prior to deciding whether to approve the substitution request.
4. The Contract Manager will notify the Contractor in writing of: (i) the acceptance or denial, or (ii) contingent or temporary approval for a specified time limit, of the requested substitution. The



Contract Manager will not unreasonably withhold approval of a proposed Contractor Personnel replacement.

E. Replacement Circumstances

1. Key Personnel Replacement

To replace any Key Personnel in a circumstance other than as described in 1.23.E.2, including transfers and promotions, the Contractor shall submit a substitution request as described in paragraph D to the Contract Manager at least fifteen (15) days prior to the intended date of change. A substitution may not occur unless and until the Contract Manager approves the substitution in writing.

2. Key Personnel Replacement Due to Vacancy

- a. The Contractor shall replace Key Personnel whenever a vacancy occurs due to the sudden termination, resignation, Extraordinary Personnel Event, or death of such personnel. (A termination or resignation with thirty (30) days or more advance notice shall be treated as a replacement under Section E.1.)
- b. Under any of the circumstances set forth in this paragraph E.2, the Contractor shall identify a suitable replacement and provide the same information and items required under paragraph D of this section within fifteen (15) days of the actual vacancy occurrence or from when the Contractor first knew or should have known that the vacancy would be occurring, whichever is earlier.

3. Key Personnel Replacement Due to an Indeterminate Absence

- a. If any Key Personnel has been absent from his/her job for a period of ten (10) days due to injury, illness, or other physical condition, or an Extraordinary Personnel Event and it is not known or reasonably anticipated that the individual will be returning to work within the next twenty (20) days to fully resume all job duties, before the 25th day of continuous absence, the Contractor shall identify a suitable replacement and provide the same information and items to the Contract Manager as required under paragraph D of this section.
- b. However, if this person is available to return to work and fully perform all job duties before a replacement has been authorized by the Contract Manager the Contract Manager may, at his/her sole discretion, authorize the original personnel to continue to work under the Contract, or authorize the replacement personnel to replace the original personnel, notwithstanding the original personnel's ability to return.

4. Directed Personnel Replacement

- a. The Contract Manager may direct the Contractor to replace any Contractor Personnel who, in the sole discretion of the Contract Manager, are perceived as being unqualified, non-productive, unable to fully perform the job duties, disruptive, or known, or reasonably believed, to have committed a major infraction(s) of law, Department policies, or Contract requirements. Normally, a directed personnel replacement will occur only after prior notification of problems with requested remediation, as described in paragraph 4.b.
- b. If deemed appropriate in the discretion of the Contract Manager, the Contract Manager shall give written notice of any Contractor Personnel performance issues to the Contractor, describing the problem and delineating the remediation requirement(s). The Contractor

shall provide a written response to the remediation requirements in a Remediation Plan within ten (10) days of the date of the notice and shall immediately implement the Remediation Plan upon written acceptance by the Contract Manager. If the Contract Manager rejects the Remediation Plan, the Contractor shall revise and resubmit the plan to the Contract Manager within five (5) days, or in the timeframe set forth by the Contract Manager in writing.

- c. Should performance issues persist despite an approved Remediation Plan, the Contract Manager may give written notice of the continuing performance issues and either request a new Remediation Plan within a specified time limit or direct the substitution of Contractor Personnel whose performance is at issue with a qualified substitute, including requiring the immediate removal of the Contractor Personnel at issue.
- d. Replacement or substitution of Contractor Personnel under this section shall be in addition to, and not in lieu of, the State's remedies under the Contract or which otherwise may be available at law or in equity.
- e. If the Contract Manager determines to direct substitution under 1.23.E.4.a, if at all possible, at least fifteen (15) days advance notice shall be given to the Contractor. However, if the Contract Manager deems it necessary and in the State's best interests to remove the Contractor Personnel with less than fifteen (15) days' notice, the Contract Manager may direct the removal in a timeframe of less than fifteen (15) days, including immediate removal.

#### F. Substitution Prior to and Within 30 Days After Contract Execution

Prior to contract execution or within thirty (30) days after contract execution, the Offeror may substitute proposed Key Personnel only under the following circumstances: vacancy occurs due to the sudden termination, resignation, or approved leave of absence due to an Extraordinary Personnel Event, or death of such personnel. To qualify for such substitution, the Offeror must demonstrate to the State's satisfaction the event necessitating substitution and that the originally proposed staff is actual full-time personnel employed directly with the Offeror (subcontractors, temporary staff or 1099 contractors do not qualify). Proposed substitutions shall be of equal caliber or higher, in the State's sole discretion. Proposed substitutes deemed by the State to be less qualified than the originally proposed individual may be grounds for pre-award disqualification or post-award termination.

### 1.24 Mandatory Contractual Terms

By submitting a Proposal in response to this RFP, an Offeror, if selected for award, shall be deemed to have accepted the terms and conditions of this RFP and the Contract, attached hereto as Attachment A. Any exceptions to this RFP or the Contract shall be clearly identified in the Executive Summary of the Technical Proposal. **The volume and severity of exceptions to the Contract terms, including the terms of the RFP, will be considered in the evaluation process and may be grounds for a determination that a Proposal is not reasonably susceptible for award.**

### 1.25 Bid/Proposal Affidavit

A Proposal submitted by an Offeror must be accompanied by a completed Bid/Proposal Affidavit. A copy of this Affidavit is included as Attachment B of this RFP.

**1.26 Contract Affidavit**

All Offerors are advised that if a Contract is awarded as a result of this solicitation, the successful Offeror will be required to complete a Contract Affidavit. A copy of this Affidavit is included for informational purposes as Attachment C of this RFP. This Affidavit must be provided within five (5) Business Days of notification of recommended award.

**1.27 Compliance with Laws/Arrearages**

- 1.27.1 By submitting a Proposal in response to this RFP, the Offeror, if selected for award, agrees that it will comply with all federal, State, and local laws applicable to its activities and obligations under the Contract.
- 1.27.2 By submitting a response to this solicitation, the Offeror also represents that it is not in arrears in the payment of any obligations due to the State of Maryland, including the payment of taxes and employee benefits, and that it shall not become so in arrears during the term of the Contract if selected for award.

**1.28 Verification of Registration and Tax Payment**

- 1.28.1 Before a business entity can do business in the State of Maryland it must be registered with the Department of Assessments and Taxation, State Office Building, Room 803, 301 West Preston Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21201. The SDAT website is <http://sdatcert3.resiusa.org/ucc-charter/>.
- 1.28.2 It is strongly recommended that any potential Offeror complete registration prior to the due date for receipt of Proposals. An Offeror's failure to complete registration with the Department of Assessments and Taxation may disqualify an otherwise successful Offeror from final consideration and recommendation for award.

**1.29 False Statements**

Offerors are advised that Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, § 11-205.1 provides as follows:

- 1.29.1 In connection with a procurement contract a person may not willfully:
- Falsify, conceal, or suppress a material fact by any scheme or device.
  - Make a false or fraudulent statement or representation of a material fact.
  - Use a false writing or document that contains a false or fraudulent statement or entry of a material fact.
- 1.29.2 A person may not aid or conspire with another person to commit an act under subsection (1) of this section.
- 1.29.3 A person who violates any provision of this section is guilty of a felony and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$20,000 or imprisonment not exceeding five years or both.

### 1.30 Payments by Electronic Funds Transfer

By submitting a response to this solicitation, the Offeror agrees to accept payments by electronic funds transfer (EFT) unless the State Comptroller's Office grants an exemption. Payment by EFT is mandatory for contracts exceeding \$100,000. The successful Offeror shall register using the COT/GAD X-10 Vendor Electronic Funds (EFT) Registration Request Form.

Any request for exemption must be submitted to the State Comptroller's Office for approval at the address specified on the COT/GAD X-10 form and must include the business identification information as stated on the form and include the reason for the exemption. ### 1.31 Prompt Payment Policy

This procurement and the Contract to be awarded pursuant to this solicitation are subject to the Prompt Payment Policy Directive issued by the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs (GOMA) and dated August 1, 2008. Promulgated pursuant to Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, §§ 11-201, 13-205(a), and Title 14, Subtitle 3, and COMAR 21.01.01.03 and 21.11.03.01, the Directive seeks to ensure the prompt payment of all subcontractors on non-construction procurement contracts. The Contractor must comply with the prompt payment requirements outlined in the Contract, Section 8 "Prompt Pay Requirements" (see Attachment A). Additional information is available on GOMA's website at: <http://goma.maryland.gov/Pages/Legislation-and-Policy.aspx>.

### 1.32 Electronic Procurements Authorized

- 1.32.1 Under COMAR 21.03.05, unless otherwise prohibited by law, a primary procurement unit may conduct procurement transactions by electronic means, including the solicitation, bidding, award, execution, and administration of a contract, as provided in Md. Code Ann., Maryland Uniform Electronic Transactions Act, Commercial Law Article, Title 21.
- 1.32.2 Participation in the solicitation process on a procurement contract for which electronic means has been authorized shall constitute consent by the Offeror to conduct by electronic means all elements of the procurement of that Contract which are specifically authorized under the solicitation or the Contract.
- 1.32.3 "Electronic means" refers to exchanges or communications using electronic, digital, magnetic, wireless, optical, electromagnetic, or other means of electronically conducting transactions. Electronic means includes facsimile, e-mail, internet-based communications, electronic funds transfer, specific electronic bidding platforms (e.g., <https://emaryland.buyspeed.com/bs/>), and electronic data interchange.
- 1.32.4 In addition to specific electronic transactions specifically authorized in other sections of this solicitation (e.g., § 1.30 "Payments by Electronic Funds Transfer") and subject to the exclusions noted in section 1.32.5 of this subsection, the following transactions are authorized to be conducted by electronic means on the terms as authorized in COMAR 21.03.05:
1. The Procurement Officer may conduct the procurement using eMM, e-mail, or facsimile to issue:

- a. the solicitation (e.g., the RFP)
  - b. any amendments
  - c. pre-Proposal conference documents
  - d. questions and responses
  - e. communications regarding the solicitation or Proposal to any Offeror or potential offeror
  - f. notices of award selection or non-selection
  - g. the Procurement Officer's decision on any solicitation protest or Contract claim
2. An Offeror or potential Offeror may use e-mail to:
- a. ask questions regarding the solicitation
  - b. reply to any material received from the Procurement Officer by electronic means that includes a Procurement Officer's request or direction to reply by e-mail or facsimile, but only on the terms specifically approved and directed by the Procurement Officer
  - c. submit a "No Bid/Proposal Response" to the solicitation
3. The Procurement Officer, the Contract Manager, and the Contractor may conduct day-to-day Contract administration, except as outlined in Section 1.32.5 of this subsection, utilizing e-mail, facsimile, or other electronic means if authorized by the Procurement Officer or Contract Manager.

1.32.5 The following transactions related to this procurement and any Contract awarded pursuant to it are *not authorized* to be conducted by electronic means:

- a. submission of initial Proposals;
- b. filing of protests;
- c. filing of Contract claims;
- d. submission of documents determined by the Department to require original signatures (e.g., Contract execution, Contract modifications); or
- e. any transaction, submission, or communication where the Procurement Officer has specifically directed that a response from the Contractor or Offeror be provided in writing or hard copy.

1.32.6 Any facsimile or e-mail transmission is only authorized to the facsimile numbers or e-mail addresses for the identified person as provided in the solicitation, the Contract, or in the direction from the Procurement Officer or Contract Manager.

### **1.33 Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Participation Goal**

There is no MBE subcontractor participation goal for this procurement.

### **1.34 Living Wage Requirements**

1.34.1 Maryland law requires that contractors meeting certain conditions pay a living wage to covered employees on State service contracts over \$100,000. Maryland Code, State Finance and

Procurement, § 18-101 et al. The Commissioner of Labor and Industry at the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation requires that a contractor subject to the Living Wage law submit payroll records for covered employees and a signed statement indicating that it paid a living wage to covered employees; or receive a waiver from Living Wage reporting requirements. See COMAR 21.11.10.05.

- 1.34.2 If subject to the Living Wage law, Contractor agrees that it will abide by all Living Wage law requirements, including but not limited to reporting requirements in COMAR 21.11.10.05. Contractor understands that failure of Contractor to provide such documents is a material breach of the terms and conditions and may result in Contract termination, disqualification by the State from participating in State contracts, and other sanctions. Information pertaining to reporting obligations may be found by going to the Maryland Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (DLLR) website <http://www.dllr.state.md.us/labor/prev/livingwage.shtml>.
- 1.34.3 Additional information regarding the State's living wage requirement is contained in Attachment G. Offerors must complete and submit the Maryland Living Wage Requirements Affidavit of Agreement (Attachment G-1) with their Proposals. If an Offeror fails to complete and submit the required documentation, the State may determine an Offeror to not be responsible under State law.
- 1.34.4 Contractors and subcontractors subject to the Living Wage Law shall pay each covered employee at least the minimum amount set by law for the applicable Tier area. The specific living wage rate is determined by whether a majority of services take place in a Tier 1 Area or a Tier 2 Area of the State. The specific Living Wage rate is determined by whether a majority of services take place in a Tier 1 Area or Tier 2 Area of the State. If the Contractor provides more than 50% of the services from an out-of-State location, the State agency determines the wage tier based on where the majority of the service recipients are located. See COMAR 21.11.10.07.
- 1.34.5 The Offeror shall identify in the Proposal the location from which services will be provided.

**NOTE: Whereas the Living Wage may change annually, the Contract price will not change because of a Living Wage change.**

### 1.35 Federal Funding Acknowledgement

The Contract does not contain federal funds.

### 1.36 Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure

- 1.36.1 Offerors shall complete and sign the Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure (Attachment I) and submit it with their Proposal. All Offerors are advised that if a Contract is awarded as a result of this solicitation, the Contractor's personnel who perform or control work under this Contract and each of the participating subcontractor personnel who perform or control work under this Contract shall be required to complete agreements substantially similar to Attachment I Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure.
- 1.36.2 Additionally, contractors have an ongoing obligation to ensure that any necessary personnel or subcontractor personnel have completed such agreements prior to providing services under

individual Task Orders issued under the Contract. For policies and procedures applying specifically to Conflict of Interests, the Contract is governed by COMAR 21.05.08.08.

1.36.3 Contractors should be aware that the State Ethics Law, Md. Code Ann., General Provisions Article, Title 5, might limit the selected Contractor's ability to participate in future related procurements, depending upon specific circumstances.

1.36.4 By submitting a Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure, the Contractor shall be construed as certifying all personnel and subcontractors are also without a conflict of interest as defined in COMAR 21.05.08.08A.

### **1.37 Non-Disclosure Agreement**

1.37.1 Non-Disclosure Agreement (Offeror)

A Non-Disclosure Agreement (Offeror) is not required for this procurement.

1.37.2 Non-Disclosure Agreement (Contractor)

A Non-Disclosure Agreement (Contractor) is not required for this procurement.

### **1.38 HIPAA - Business Associate Agreement**

A HIPAA Business Associate Agreement is not required for this procurement.

### **1.39 Non-Visual Access**

1.39.1 By submitting a Proposal, the Offeror warrants that the information technology offered under the Proposal: (1) provides equivalent access for effective use by both visual and non-visual means; (2) will present information, including prompts used for interactive communications, in formats intended for both visual and non-visual use; (3) if intended for use in a network, can be integrated into networks for obtaining, retrieving, and disseminating information used by individuals who are not blind or visually impaired; and (4) is available, whenever possible, without modification for compatibility with software and hardware for non-visual access. The Offeror further warrants that the cost, if any, of modifying the information technology for compatibility with software and hardware used for non-visual access will not increase the cost of the information technology by more than five percent (5%). For purposes of this solicitation, the phrase "equivalent access" means the ability to receive, use and manipulate information and operate controls necessary to access and use information technology by non-visual means. Examples of equivalent access include keyboard controls used for input and synthesized speech, Braille, or other audible or tactile means used for output.

1.39.2 The Non-visual Access Clause noted in COMAR 21.05.08.05 and referenced in this solicitation is the basis for the standards that have been incorporated into the Maryland regulations, which can be found at: [www.doit.maryland.gov](http://www.doit.maryland.gov), keyword: NVA.

### **1.40 Mercury and Products That Contain Mercury**

This solicitation does not include the procurement of products known to likely include mercury as a component.

**1.41 Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise Goals**

There is no Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) subcontractor participation goal for this procurement.

**1.42 Location of the Performance of Services Disclosure**

The Offeror is required to complete the Location of the Performance of Services Disclosure. A copy of this Disclosure is included as Attachment N. The Disclosure must be provided with the Proposal.

**1.43 Department of Human Resources (DHR) Hiring Agreement**

This solicitation does not require a DHR Hiring Agreement.

**1.44 Purchasing and Recycling Electronic Products**

This section does not apply to this solicitation.

**1.45 Contract Extended To Include Other Non-State Governments or Agencies**

For the purposes of an information technology or telecommunications procurement, pursuant to sections 3A-401(b) and 13-110 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, county, municipal, State entities that are not subject to DoIT's authority, including State non-executive branch entities, and non-State governments or agencies may purchase from the Contractor goods or services covered by this Contract at the same maximum prices to which the State would be subject under the resulting Contract. All such purchases:

- (1) shall constitute Contracts between the Contractor and that government, agency or organization;
- (2) For non-State entities, shall not constitute purchases by the State or State agencies under this Contract;
- (3) For non-State entities, shall not be binding or enforceable against the State; and
- (4) may be subject to other terms and conditions agreed to by the Contractor and the purchaser. The Contractor bears the risk of determining whether or not a government, agency or organization with which the Contractor is dealing is a State entity.

**1.46 Pricing for Contract/Contract Modifications**

The rates for services shall remain the same or lower than the rates provided in Contractor's Financial Proposal through the base term of the contract and any renewal options.

The Contractor may temporarily lower the rates charged to the State at any time during the Contract by submitting revised service rates to the Procurement Officer and Contract Manager.

The Contractor may propose any permanent rate reductions to the Procurement Officer for inclusion in a contract modification. The proposal shall include all contract pricing tables, and the effective date(s) of the price reduction, even if the price reduction is retroactive to a date before the proposal.

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## 2 COMPANY AND PERSONNEL QUALIFICATIONS

### 2.1 Offeror Minimum Qualifications

To be considered reasonably susceptible for award, an Offeror must provide proof with its Proposal that the following Minimum Qualifications have been met:

- 2.1.1 Offeror shall provide three (3) references demonstrating its capability to provide Toll Free Services of similar size and scope to the services required by this RFP. (e.g. Corporate, Federal, State or Local Government) .
- a. All three engagements must have been performed within the three (3) years preceding the issuance of this RFP.
  - b. At least one engagement must have lasted longer than two (2) calendar years.
  - c. At least one reference must have had an average call volume of one (1) million calls per month over a 12 month period.

**Note: Subcontractor experience may not be used by Offeror to meet Minimum Qualifications. The minimum qualifications must be met by the Offeror/Contractor.**

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### 3 SCOPE OF WORK

#### 3.1 Background and Purpose

The Department is issuing this Request for Proposals (RFP) to award one statewide contract to procure toll free services. The resulting Contract will provide the State with toll free services which shall be terminated via Common Business Lines (CBLs).

The awarded Offeror shall be able to perform all requirements as detailed in Section 3 of the RFP. Offerors shall be required to furnish satisfactory evidence that they meet or exceed all minimum qualifications listed in Section 2 of this RFP.

#### 3.2 Agency / Project Background

3.2.1 DoIT currently provides a statewide Toll Free Services contract for use by all State agencies. Each State agency is required to maintain at least one toll free number available for citizen access.

#### 3.3 General Requirements

##### 3.3.1 Required Project Policies, Guidelines and Methodologies

The Contractor shall be required to comply with all applicable laws, regulations, policies, standards and guidelines affecting toll free services, which may be created or changed periodically. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure adherence and to remain abreast of new or revised laws, regulations, policies, standards and guidelines affecting Contract execution.

3.3.2 Any Contractor Personnel provided under this RFP shall maintain any required professional certifications for the duration of the resulting Contract.

3.3.3 The equipment handling the toll-free services traffic shall be located within the contiguous 48 states of the United States of America. Offeror shall provide documentation such as network diagrams supporting fulfillment of this requirement.

##### 3.3.4 Transition-In Requirements

3.3.4.1 The Contractor shall provide a project manager who shall create a transition-in (at the beginning of the Contract) and transition-out (at the end of the Contract) plan for all toll free numbers. The project manager shall be assigned to the project until the transition has been completed.

3.3.4.2 The transition-in shall take no longer than 180 days after the NTP date.

3.3.4.3 The transition-in shall be complete when all items identified in Section 3.3.4 have been accepted by the Contract Manager as being successfully completed.

3.3.4.4 It is the Contractor's responsibility to ensure that, at the end of the transition-in period, all accounts transitioned or active under the resulting Contract:

a) Have an account name in the format of SOMD XXX "Identifier" where:

1. SOMD is the first word of the name
2. XXX is an agency acronym that is approved by the Contract Manager
3. The “Identifier” is defined by the Requesting/Billed Agency, with a minimum of 125 characters
4. The acronym SOMD may only be used for the accounts under this (and any other as deemed appropriate by the DoIT contract manager) resulting contract.

- b) Display a correct mailing address as submitted by the State
- c) Are consolidated as requested by the State at no additional charge
- d) Have web portal logins with the appropriate access permissions for both the Requesting/Billed Agency and all DoIT voice services personnel.
- e) Are included in the statewide inventory report (See Section 3.9.2).

3.3.4.5 The process for State agencies to validate and change ownership of toll free numbers described in Section 3.3.12 shall be documented and in place prior to the end of transition-in.

### 3.3.5 Transition-Out Requirements

3.3.5.1 The Contractor shall provide a project manager to support a smooth transition-out period at the end of the Contract. The services to be provided are:

- A. Providing accurate inventory reports on demand during the transition period
- B. Clarifying whether toll free numbers are on a State-owned account
- C. Attendance at transition meetings as requested and serving as the Contractor’s liaison to the transition project.

3.3.5.2 During the transition-out period, the Contractor will continue to be paid at the pre-determined rate as set forth in the Price Sheet, Attachment F.

3.3.5.3 The Contractor shall support end-of-contract transition efforts with technical and project support including, but not limited to:

- A. Providing additional services and/or support as requested to successfully complete the transition.
- B. Providing experienced personnel to ensure an efficient and smooth transition.
- C. Guaranteeing that the services called for by the Contract are maintained at the required level of proficiency during the transition period.

3.3.6 The Contractor shall notify the Contract Manager two (2) calendar weeks in advance by confirmed e-mail, telephone or fax of any planned service outages that may affect the State’s services provided, or describe alternate plans.

3.3.7 At all times during the period of performance for the Contract, the Contractor shall maintain current processes and procedures for restoring service for situations where a reported service interruption cannot be resolved within eight (8) hours and for services that cannot be restored within 24 hours. Service transfer capabilities and the lag time to implement must be described

for both types of service outage scenarios. The Contractor shall provide details of these procedures, upon request of the State.

- 3.3.8 At all times during the period of performance for the Contract, the Contractor shall maintain a transition plan to be utilized when transitioning from the Contractor to another provider. The plan must include the processes for transitioning services from the Contractor to another provider upon the issuance of a notice-to-proceed for the new Contract. It must also include the process to transfer services to the new provider prior to the termination of the contract period. The Contractor shall provide the plan, upon request of the State.
- 3.3.9 All services shall be provided on a 24x7x365 basis.
- 3.3.10 Subcontractors
- 3.3.10.1 The Contractor shall identify all Subcontractors and shall include a complete description of their roles. The Contractor shall strive to maintain the Subcontractors as originally proposed to the State. Any changes or additions by the Contractor of its Subcontractors shall be pre-approved by the Contract Manager.
- 3.3.10.2 The Contractor shall be responsible for all work performed by its Subcontractor(s).
- 3.3.11 The Contractor's work shall be executed in such a manner that it does not disrupt day-to-day functions of the Department or cause any unauthorized disruptions to existing telecommunications services.
- 3.3.12 Process to Validate State Toll Free Numbers
- 3.3.12.1 The Contractor shall document a methodology to be used for the length of the Contract that allows State agencies to determine if a toll free number is associated with an account that is part of the resulting Contract.
- 3.3.12.2 The methodology shall accept both electronic inquiries and telephone inquiries.
- 3.3.12.3 A response to an inquiry shall be provided no later than three (3) business days. The response shall identify the toll free number in question plus a statement identifying whether the toll free number is or is not on a State account. If the number is on a State account, the account number shall be provided with the response.
- 3.3.12.4 The Contractor shall notify the Contract Manager if the requested toll free number is on a State-owned account but does not show up in either: the web portal listing of State's accounts or the inventory report (see Section 3.9.2).
- 3.3.12.5 The Contractor shall provide a mechanism to correct ownership for toll free numbers assigned to any account under the Contract. The authorization for initiating changes shall be consistent with the access permissions as described in Section 3.3.15 Account Access. The correction shall be completed within thirty (30) days, shall be included in the first inventory report after the correction is completed (see Section 3.9.2), and shall be displayed on the web portal listing the State's accounts.
- 3.3.13 The Contractor shall provide a mechanism to perform an audit of services that appear on an invoice. When requested, this audit of services shall be performed at no additional charge,

shall be completed within thirty (30) days of request, and shall indicate any services billed on the invoice that have not been used within the last ninety (90) days.

### 3.3.14 Invoicing Requirements

The Contractor shall comply with invoice labeling and invoicing increment requirements as defined in Section 3.13 Invoicing.

### 3.3.15 Account Access

- 3.3.15.1 Account information shall be available to both DoIT and the Requesting/Billed Agency for each account created or transitioned under the resulting Contract. Information shall be available via the Contractor's customer service agents, account team and a web portal.
- 3.3.15.2 As the issuing Department for the Contract, DoIT shall have full access for all accounts created and/or transitioned under the resulting Contract in addition to the Requesting/Billed Agency that manages each individual account.
- 3.3.15.3 The Contractor shall provide account access to the appropriate Requesting/Billed Agency personnel for each account under the Contract.
- 3.3.15.4 The Contractor shall enforce appropriate account access and permissions such that only authorized personnel may modify or view account-level information associated with that account.
- 3.3.15.5 Account access for DoIT and the Requesting/Billed Agency shall include the ability to:
- a) Order, cancel, modify or obtain status on a service order (e.g., "change order"). See also Section 3.5.
  - b) Open, cancel, modify or obtain status on a repair (e.g., "trouble ticket"). See also Section 3.7.
  - c) View and update account billing information.
  - d) View and update an account with which a phone number is associated.
- 3.3.15.6 Information and/or access for DoIT and the Requesting/Billed Agency to accounts and individual telephone numbers shall be possible by any mechanism available, including, but not limited to: telephone requests, email requests, web access (including web portals), and account reports.
- 3.3.15.7 The Contractor shall provide web-enabled billing management / account management tools.

### 3.3.16 Service Requirements

- 3.3.16.1 The Contractor shall provide toll free telecommunications service offerings to the State that shall include inbound toll free services terminated on CBLs.
- 3.3.16.2 The Contractor shall adhere to all applicable ratified industry standards (e.g., Bellcore, American National Standards Institute (ANSI), FCC, and Electronic Industries Association (EIA)/Telecommunications Industries Association (TIA)) for all services provided. The exception to these requirements is if a service-specific standard is explicitly specified in the service description.

3.3.16.2.1 Compliance with the latest versions of standards is required throughout the duration of the Contract.

3.3.16.2.2 A schedule will be established by the State to implement new standards or changes to existing ones. New implementations and/or changes to maintain conformance with Contractor imposed standards shall be made at no additional cost to the State.

3.3.16.3 The Contractor shall be responsible for all aspects of service quality, reliability, interconnectivity, and interoperability of services up to the points of interface. For CBLs, it is the Contractor's responsibility to ensure that the call is handed off to the appropriate local carrier as determined by the terminating number. The Contractor shall be required to initiate (and track to completion) service tickets to all entities involved in the transport of the call, until it reaches the CPE.

3.3.16.4 The Contractor shall have a plan for ensuring full interoperability among networks, services, and features. Partial interoperability is unacceptable. The service Contractor's capabilities shall include, but are not limited to, interoperation with the Public Switched Telephone Network (PSTN) and any other network or system that is interoperable with the PSTN.

3.3.16.5 The Contractor shall provide network intercept to recorded announcements as an inherent network capability when a call or call-attempt cannot be completed. At a minimum, such announcements shall be provided for the following conditions: number disconnected, incorrect number of digits dialed, time-out during dialing and network congestion.

### 3.3.17 Technical Requirements

At a minimum the following toll free service offerings shall be made to the State:

3.3.17.1 The Contractor shall provide basic Toll Free Services via CBLs.

3.3.17.2 There shall be no charge for the actual toll free numbers.

3.3.17.3 The Contractor shall provide per-minute pricing that is inclusive of all taxes and surcharges.

3.3.17.4 The Contractor shall provide service announcements, such as but not limited to, disconnect of service, out of service and referral of calls, office closings due to weather, office hours.

3.3.17.5 The Contractor shall provide the following toll free features included in the per-minute rate:

- a) Dialed Number Identification Service (DNIS) – Route two or more toll free numbers to a multi-line customer service group and receive a one (1) to two (2) digit code to identify toll free number called.
- b) Automatic Number Identification (ANI) – Provides the toll free caller's phone number.
- c) Command Routing - Routes calls differently to an alternate destination on immediate command of the Requesting/Billed Agency. Command routing should

occur instantaneously, but, in any event, no later than ten (10) minutes of request by the Requesting/Billed Agency.

- d) Payphone Blocking - Blocks toll free calls from public payphones.
- e) Area Code Block – Block toll free calls from customer identified area codes.
- f) Area Code and Exchange Block – Block toll free calls from customer identified area codes and local exchanges.
- g) Toll Free Directory – Availability of being listed in National Toll Free Directory Assistance database.
- h) Enhanced Call Routing – Route toll free calls to different location by:
  - i. Time of day
  - ii. Day of week
  - iii. Day of year
  - iv. Originating area code local exchange
  - v. Percentage basis

### 3.4 Security Requirements

3.4.1 The Contractor shall comply with and adhere to the Maryland State IT Security Policy and Standards. These policies may be revised from time to time and the Contractor shall comply with all such revisions. Updated and revised versions of the Maryland State IT Policy and Standards are available on-line at [www.DoIT.maryland.gov](http://www.DoIT.maryland.gov) - keyword: Security Policy.

3.4.2 Security of Contractor's Infrastructure

3.4.2.1 Contractor-owned Computer Equipment. The Contractor shall not connect any of its own equipment to an Agency's LAN/WAN without prior written approval by the State.

3.4.2.2 The Contractor shall complete any necessary paperwork for security access to sign on at the State's site if access is needed to the State's LAN/WAN, as directed and coordinated with the delegate of the Contract Manager.

### 3.5 Service Order Fulfillment

3.5.1 Any service not designated on the Financial Proposal shall not be provided to any Requesting/Billed Agency without a modification to the Contract approved by DoIT. See also Section 3.6 Procedure for Adding a Service Offering.

3.5.2 Service Ordering/Cancellation Process

The Contractor shall have a service order procedure consisting of:

3.5.2.1 Service Order Submission

- a) At least one (1) email address to place a service order, cancel a service order, and request service order status.
- b) Every e-mail address provided shall be dedicated to State of Maryland accounts, and shall only be answered by departments that can service State of Maryland accounts.

- c) A web-enabled capability to place a service order, cancel a service order, and request service order status.
- d) A service order number shall be provided at the time of request.
- e) The Contractor shall only process service orders demonstrating DoIT approval and which fall under the scope of this Contract. DoIT approval is determined by the Contractor verifying a Purchase Order (PO) has been issued with the BPO number and a proper signature (signature may be electronic).
- f) Within three (3) business days of service order submission, the Contractor shall confirm to the original requestor, and any cc: email addresses, via email the date of request, description of the service, service order number, estimated delivery date, toll free number, and related information.

#### 3.5.2.2 Service Order Tracking

- a) The Contractor shall provide a web-enabled service order tracking system with the capability to obtain service order status.
- b) That tracking system shall provide a detailed record of changes identifying:
  - i. the date the order is scheduled to be completed
  - ii. the date the order was completed.
- c) The original requestor, and any cc: email addresses, shall be provided email status updates and an emailed order completion notification.

#### 3.5.2.3 Billing charges for disconnect orders shall be stopped no more than fifteen (15) calendar days from the date the order is sent by the State.

### 3.6 Procedure for Adding a Service Offering

3.6.1 The Contractor may propose new service offerings that may become available during the life of the Contract. A Contractor's request to add new Toll Free Service Offerings not part of the original Financial Proposal shall require a contract modification approved by DoIT throughout the life of this Contract.

### 3.7 Service Center and Trouble Reporting Capabilities

#### 3.7.1 Contractor Service Center Capabilities

The Contractor shall have service centers with remote maintenance capability, staffing, and security. The State reserves the right to inspect the Contractor's service center(s) prior to award.

- a) The Contractor shall provide a 24-hour staffed service center.
- b) The Contractor shall provide a dedicated Service Manager (see Section 1.23).
- c) The Contractor shall provide service telephone numbers to the State that are answered by departments servicing State of Maryland accounts.



- d) At least one dedicated telephone number shall be provided to allow the State to cancel a service order and request service order status.

### 3.7.2 Repairs/Trouble Tickets

The Contractor shall provide a documented procedure for standard trouble reporting and escalation of all trouble tickets to the Service Manager, to include the following minimum capabilities:

- a) A problem shall be able to be reported via any of: the telephone, the web, or email.
- b) Problem reporting procedures shall describe the process and information needed to complete a trouble ticket by any of the supported problem reporting mechanisms.
- c) Problem reporting procedures shall indicate the repair telephone number(s), web addresses, and/or email accounts to be used for each type of service.
- d) Telephone numbers provided to the State of Maryland shall only be answered by Contractor Personnel that service the State of Maryland accounts.
- e) Problem reporting procedures shall include procedures for how to escalate an outage for an immediate response (i.e., emergency call).
- f) The Contractor procedures shall keep the original ticket open until customer validates issue has been resolved.
- g) The current procedure shall be made available online to all Telecommunications Coordinators (TCs).
- h) All TCs shall be notified of updates to trouble reporting and trouble ticket escalation procedures.
- i) Each trouble ticket shall track data to support the following:
  - i. Time between problem reported and commencement of resolution actions
  - ii. Time between problem reported and service restoration
  - iii. Time of problem escalation
  - iv. Time between escalation and commencement of resolution actions
  - v. Time between escalation and service restoration

### 3.7.3 Trouble Ticket Tracking

- a) The Contractor shall provide the capability for the State to obtain trouble ticket status via a web-enabled mechanism.
- b) A detailed record of changes shall be provided for each trouble ticket starting from the original trouble ticket request to final resolution.
- c) The original requestor shall be provided email status updates and an emailed resolution notification.

## 3.8 Offeror Requirements

### 3.8.1 Problem Reporting

The Offeror shall submit its written procedures for reporting problems or suspected problems for the services required in this RFP.

### 3.8.2 Coordination Procedures

The Offeror shall submit its written coordination procedures for equipment repair services in this RFP.

### 3.8.3 Process for Resolving Billing Errors

The Offeror shall submit a copy of its process for resolving billing errors.

### 3.8.4 Invoicing Procedures and Samples

The Offeror shall submit a description of its invoicing procedures and sample invoices.

## 3.9 Reports and Meetings

### 3.9.1 Status/Service Meetings

- A. The Contractor is required to meet monthly with the Contract Manager or designee. Meetings are normally face-to-face and are held in Annapolis, Maryland, but may also utilize audio or web conferencing at the discretion of the Contract Manager
- B. For each scheduled meeting, the Contractor shall submit an electronic status report, itemizing all relevant transactions between the State and the Contractor for the prior month, the planned activities and accomplishments for the current month and any issues with a proposed solution requiring the attention of the Contract Manager or DoIT management. Attendees for these monthly meetings shall include but not be limited to Contractor's Contract Administrator, Contractor's Transition Project Manager, Contractor's Billing Administrator, Contractor's Service Manager, Contract Manager and any designees.

### 3.9.2 Inventory Reports

- A. The Contractor shall produce an inventory report for each active account billed under the resulting Contract. During the transition-in period, the inventory report shall be produced monthly. After transition-in is complete, the report shall be produced at a minimum of once every quarter (quarters shall end March, June, September and December). The inventory report shall be forwarded electronically to the Contact Manager no later than fifteen (15) business days after the end of the quarter. The inventory report shall include the account number; Requesting/ Billed agency name and agency contact. The report shall include the following information:
  1. The account number
  2. The billing name (corresponding to naming convention in Section 3.3.4.4)
  3. The billing address
  4. The contact name
  5. The toll free number(s) on that account
  6. Terminating number of the CBL

- B. The inventory report shall be available in Excel format (Excel 2007 or greater).
- C. The Contract Manager shall be notified via email when a new inventory report is available.
- D. The recipients of the inventory report shall be DoIT and any State entity acting as a “Requesting/Billed Agency” authorized by the Contract Manager
- E. The scope of each inventory report shall be consistent with the recipient’s access permissions as described in Section 3.3.15 Account Access.

### 3.9.3 Invoicing Reports

- A. At a minimum of every month, the Contractor shall generate and provide to the Contract Manager a report that includes the following information for each active account invoiced under the resulting Contract:
  - B. For Each Account:
    - 1. The account name (corresponding to naming convention in Section 3.3.4.4)
    - 2. The account number
    - 3. The total minutes for each call type (local, local toll, interstate)
    - 4. The total minutes for all call types
    - 5. The total usage cost for each call type
    - 6. The total cost for all call types
  - C. For the Report Totals
    - 1. The total number of usage minutes by call type
    - 2. The total minutes for all call types
    - 3. The total usage cost for each call type
    - 4. The total cost for all call types
- D. The report shall be available in Excel format (Excel 2007 or later). The Contract Manager shall be notified when a new invoicing report is available.

### 3.9.4 Additional Reports

The Contractor shall provide additional reports for managing State accounts as requested by the Contract Manager.

Additional reports shall be available via the web portal and access shall be consistent with the recipient’s access permissions as described in Section 3.3.15 Account Access.

## 3.10 Labor Categories and Qualifications

This Section is not applicable to this RFP.

## 3.11 Service Level Agreement (SLA)

A Service Level Agreement is not a requirement for this Contract.

**3.12 Insurance Requirements**

- 3.12.1 The Contractor and all of its Subcontractors shall maintain the insurance coverages outlined below for the duration of the Contract, including option periods, if exercised. The coverage limits set forth are the minimum required.
- 3.12.2 Any insurance furnished as a condition of this Contract shall be issued by a company authorized to conduct business in the State.
- 3.12.3 Insurance shall be provided as specified in the Contract (Attachment A).
- 3.12.4 The recommended awardee must provide a certificate(s) of insurance with the prescribed coverages, limits and requirements set forth in this Section 3.12 “Insurance Requirements,” within five (5) Business Days from notice of recommended award. During the period of performance for multi-year contracts the Contractor shall update certificates of insurance annually, or as otherwise directed by the Contract Manager.
- 3.12.5 The following type(s) of insurance and minimum amount(s) of coverage are required:
- 3.12.5.1 General Liability - The Contractor shall maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance with limits sufficient to cover losses resulting from, or arising out of, Contractor action or inaction in the performance of the Contract by the Contractor, its agents, servants, employees, or subcontractors, but no less than a Combined Single Limit for Bodily Injury, Property Damage, and Personal and Advertising Injury Liability of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$3,000,000 aggregate.
- 3.12.5.2 Worker’s Compensation - The Contractor shall maintain such insurance as necessary and/or as required under Workers’ Compensation Acts, the Longshore and Harbor Workers’ Compensation Act, and the Federal Employers’ Liability Act. Coverage must be valid in all states where work is performed at the levels required by that state.
- 3.12.6 State Inclusion on Insurance
- The State shall be listed as an additional insured on all policies with the exception of Worker’s Compensation Insurance and Professional Liability Insurance. All insurance policies shall be endorsed to include a clause that requires that the insurance carrier provide the Contract Manager, by certified mail, not less than 45 days’ advance notice of any non-renewal, cancellation, or expiration. In the event the Contract Manager receives a notice of non-renewal, the Contractor shall provide the Contract Manager with an insurance policy from another carrier at least 30 days prior to the expiration of the insurance policy then in effect.
- 3.12.7 Subcontractor Insurance
- The Contractor shall require that any Subcontractors providing products/services under this Contract obtain and maintain similar levels of insurance and shall provide the Contract Manager with the same documentation as is required of the Contractor.

**3.13 Invoicing**

- 3.13.1 All invoices shall be submitted by the Contractor within 30 days of delivery of products/services and shall include, at the minimum, the following information:

- a. Name and address of the Requesting/Billed Agency
- b. Contractor name and contact information
- c. Description of Services; Products(s) and/or service(s) purchased listed separately including the amount for each individual charge (i.e., 5 – ABC Hardware @ \$2,000 Total \$10,000.00, 2 - CD Training @ \$100.00 Total \$200.00, Installation one-time cost \$300.00)
- d. Supporting Documentation
- e. E-mail address/phone number of Contractor's POC
- f. Remittance address
- g. Federal taxpayer identification or (if owned by an individual) Contractor's social security number
- h. Invoice period, invoice date, invoice number and amount due; and
- i. Purchase Order # and/or Blanket Purchase Order Number being billed
- j. Itemized calls
- k. Adjustments

3.13.2 Billing for itemized calls shall:

- a. be in no greater than six(6) second increments,
- b. Identify the date, starting time and duration of each call,
- c. Display the contracted rate and not a tariff rate with a summarized discount amount

3.13.3 The Contractor shall clearly label the toll free number associated with each service billed on an invoice.

3.13.4 An invoice shall meet the account name labeling requirement stated in Section 3.3.4.4.

3.13.5 For discontinued services, the invoice shall meet requirements stated in Section 3.5.2.3.

3.13.6 The Contractor shall send the original of each invoice as instructed in the related Purchase Order.

3.13.7 Invoices submitted without the required information will not be processed for payment until the Contractor provides the required information.

3.13.8 In no event, shall any invoice be submitted later than 60 calendar days from the Contract termination date.

3.13.9 Billing Errors

If the Contractor identifies a billing error, it shall notify the Contract Manager of the start and end date of the affected period, the amount of the error, and the reason for the error.

3.13.9.1 Undercharges

Upon approval by the Contract Manager, the Contractor may retroactively bill for the lesser of either the total amount undercharged during the affected period or the total amount undercharged during the most recent three (3) months of the affected period.

#### 3.13.9.2 Overcharges

Upon its identification of an overcharge, the Contractor shall credit the full amount overcharged from the date the billing error began until the error was corrected.

#### 3.13.9.3 Effect on Other State Accounts

Once a billing error has been identified, the Contractor shall, at the Contract Manager's Request, check all State accounts under the resulting Contract to ensure the error has not impacted multiple State accounts. If the billing error does impact multiple accounts, each account shall have the appropriate credits/debits applied as described in 3.13.9.1 and 3.13.9.2.

### **3.14 SOC 2 Type II Audit Report**

A SOC 2 Type II Report is not a requirement for this Contract.

### **3.15 Individual Case Basis (ICB) Contract**

The Contractor agrees to make any necessary filings with the FCC and the State of Maryland PSC, as required by law, which shall incorporate the rate-affecting terms and conditions contained in the contract documents, and which shall provide that the filings shall be construed in a manner that is consistent with the terms and conditions of this Contract. In all cases, State terms and conditions set forth in this RFP and Attachment A (the Contract) take precedence over any tariff terms and conditions. Contractor agrees that all pricing is monthly pricing and there are to be no termination liability charges applied to this Contract.

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## 4 PROPOSAL FORMAT

### 4.1 Two-Part Submission

Offerors shall submit Proposals in separate volumes:

- a) Volume I – TECHNICAL PROPOSAL
- b) Volume II – FINANCIAL PROPOSAL

### 4.2 Volume I – Technical Proposal

**Note: Provide no pricing information in the Technical Proposal (Volume I). Include pricing information only in the Financial Proposal (Volume II).**

#### 4.2.1 Format of Technical Proposal

The Technical Proposal will include all items detailed below. In addition to the following instructions, responses in the Offeror's Technical Proposal must reference the RFP's organization and section numbering (ex. "Section 3.2.1 Response"). This proposal organization will allow direct mapping between Offeror responses and RFP requirements by Section number and will aid in the evaluation process.

4.2.2 The Technical Proposal shall include the following documents and information in the order specified as follows. Each section of the Technical Proposal shall be separated by a TAB as detailed below:

##### 4.2.2.1 Title Page and Table of Contents (Submit under TAB A)

The Technical Proposal should begin with a Title Page bearing the name and address of the Offeror and the name and number of this RFP. A Table of Contents shall follow the Title Page for the Technical Proposal, organized by section, subsection, and page number.

##### 4.2.2.2 Claim of Confidentiality (If applicable, submit under TAB A-1)

Any information which is claimed to be confidential is to be noted by reference and included after the Title Page and before the Table of Contents, and if applicable, also in the Offeror's Financial Proposal. The entire Proposal cannot be given a blanket confidentiality designation - any confidentiality designation must apply to specific sections, pages, or portions of pages of the Proposal and an explanation for each claim shall be included (see Section 1.14 "Public Information Act Notice").

##### 4.2.2.3 Transmittal Letter (Submit under TAB B)

A Transmittal Letter shall accompany the Technical Proposal. The purpose of this letter is to transmit the Proposal and acknowledge the receipt of any addenda. The Transmittal Letter should be brief and signed by an individual who is authorized to commit the Offeror to its Proposal and the requirements as stated in this RFP. The Transmittal Letter should include the following:

- A. Name and address of the Offeror;
- B. Name, title, e-mail address, and telephone number of primary contact for the Offeror;
- C. Solicitation Title and Solicitation Number that the Proposal is in response to;

- D. Signature, typed name, and title of an individual authorized to commit the Offeror to its Proposal;
- E. Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN) of the Offeror, or if a single individual, that individual’s Social Security Number (SSN);
- F. Offeror’s eMM number;
- G. Offeror’s MBE certification number (if applicable);
- H. Acceptance of all State RFP and Contract terms and conditions (see Section 1.24); if any exceptions are taken, they are to be noted in the Executive Summary (see Section 4.2.2.4); and
- I. Acknowledgement of all addenda to this RFP issued before the Proposal due date.

4.2.2.4 Executive Summary (Submit under TAB C)

The Offeror shall condense and highlight the contents of the Technical Proposal in a separate section titled “Executive Summary.” The Summary should identify the Service Category(ies) and Region(s) for which the Offeror is proposing to provide products/services (if applicable). The Summary shall also identify any exceptions the Offeror has taken to the requirements of this RFP, the Contract (Attachment A), or any other attachments. **Excessive exceptions to terms and conditions may result in having the Proposal deemed unacceptable or classified as not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.**

If the Offeror has taken no exceptions to the requirements of this RFP, the Executive Summary shall so state. Acceptance or rejection of exceptions is within the sole discretion of the State. If there are no assumptions, the Offeror shall so state.

4.2.2.5 Minimum Qualifications Documentation (If applicable, Submit under TAB D)

The Offeror shall submit any Minimum Qualifications documentation as set forth in Section 2 “Offeror Minimum Qualifications.”

#### 4.2.2.6 Offeror Technical Response to RFP Requirements and Proposed Work Plan (Submit under TAB E)

- A. The Offeror shall address each Scope of Work requirement (Section 3) in its Technical Proposal and describe how its proposed products/services, including the products/services of any proposed subcontractor(s), will meet or exceed the requirement(s). If the State is seeking Offeror agreement to any requirement(s), the Offeror shall state its agreement or disagreement. Any paragraph in the Technical Proposal that responds to a Scope of Work requirement shall include an explanation of how the work will be performed. Any exception to a requirement, term, or condition may result in having the Proposal classified as not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award or the Offeror deemed not responsible. The response shall address each requirement in Section 3 of this RFP in order, and shall contain a cross reference to the RFP requirement.
- B. The Offeror shall identify the location(s) from which it proposes to provide the services, including, if applicable, any current facilities that it operates, and any required construction to satisfy the State's requirements as outlined in this RFP.
- C. The Offeror shall provide a sample Inventory Report as described in Section 3.9.2 that demonstrates the Offeror's ability to generate reports.

#### 4.2.2.7 Experience and Qualifications of Proposed Staff (Submit under TAB F)

The Offeror shall identify the number and types of staff proposed to be utilized under the Contract.

The Offeror shall describe in detail how the proposed staff's experience and qualifications relate to their specific responsibilities, including any staff of proposed subcontractor(s), as detailed in the Work Plan. The Offeror shall include individual resumes for the key personnel, including key personnel for any proposed subcontractor(s), who are to be assigned to the project if the Offeror is awarded the Contract. Each resume should include the amount of experience the individual has had relative to the Scope of Work set forth in this solicitation. Letters of intended commitment to work on the project, including letters from any proposed subcontractor(s), shall be included in this section. **Offerors be aware of restrictions on substitution of key personnel prior to RFP award (see Section 1.23.E Substitution Prior to and Within 30 Days After Contract Execution).**

The Offeror shall provide an Organizational Chart outlining personnel and their related duties. The Offeror shall include job titles and the percentage of time each individual will spend on his/her assigned tasks. Offerors using job titles other than those commonly used by industry standards must provide a crosswalk reference document.

#### 4.2.2.8 Offeror Qualifications and Capabilities (Submit under TAB G)

The Offeror shall include information on past experience with similar projects and/or services. The Offeror shall describe how its organization can meet the requirements of this RFP and shall also include the following information:

- A. The number of years the Offeror has provided the similar services;
- B. The number of clients/customers and geographic locations that the Offeror currently serves;

- i. Technical skills and certifications of the Offeror's employees associated with providing installation and maintenance of services;
    - ii. The number of clients and geographic locations the Offeror currently serves; and,
    - iii. Implementation of similar services.
  - C. The names and titles of the key personnel directly involved with supervising the services rendered under this Contract. Offerors who present key personnel will be ranked higher if the key personnel are employees of the Offeror
  - D. The names and titles of headquarters or regional management personnel who may be involved with supervising the services to be performed under this Contract;
  - E. The Offeror's process for resolving billing errors; and
  - F. An organizational chart that identifies the complete structure of the Offeror including any parent company, headquarters, regional offices, and subsidiaries of the Offeror. The Offeror shall provide an Organizational Chart outlining all major component units, which components will perform the requirements of this Contract, where the management of this Contract will fall within the organization, and what corporate resources will be available to support this Contract in primary, secondary, and back-up roles.

#### 4.2.2.9 References (Submit under TAB H)

At least three (3) references are requested from customers who are capable of documenting the Offeror's ability to provide the products/services specified in this RFP. References used to meet any Offeror Minimum Qualifications (see Section 2) may be used to meet this request. Each reference shall be from a client for whom the Offeror has provided products/services within the past five (5) years and shall include the following information:

- A. Name of client organization;
- B. Name, title, telephone number, and e-mail address, if available, of point of contact within client organization; and
- C. Value, type, duration, and description of products/services provided.
- D. The services provided, scope of the Contract, objectives satisfied

The Department reserves the right to request additional references or utilize references not provided by an Offeror. Points of contact must be accessible and knowledgeable regarding Offeror performance. Each reference must be able to confirm the services provided by the Offeror and Offeror's ability to manage services of comparable size and complexity.

#### 4.2.2.10 List of Current or Prior State Contracts (Submit under TAB I)

Provide a list of all contracts with any entity of the State of Maryland for which the Offeror is currently performing products/services or for which services have been completed within the last five (5) years. For each identified contract, the Offeror is to provide:

- A. The State contracting entity;
- B. A brief description of the products/services provided;
- C. The dollar value of the contract;

- D. The term of the contract;
- E. The State employee contact person (name, title, telephone number, and, if possible, e-mail address); and
- F. Whether the contract was terminated before the end of the term specified in the original contract, including whether any available renewal option was not exercised.

Information obtained regarding the Offeror's level of performance on State contracts will be used by the Procurement Officer to determine the responsibility of the Offeror and considered as part of the experience and past performance evaluation criteria of the RFP.

#### 4.2.2.11 Financial Capability (Submit under TAB J)

An Offeror must include in its Proposal a commonly-accepted method to prove its fiscal integrity. If available, the Offeror shall include Financial Statements, preferably a Profit and Loss (P&L) statement and a Balance Sheet, for the last two (2) years (independently audited preferred).

In addition, the Offeror may supplement its response to this Section by including one or more of the following with its response:

- A. Dunn and Bradstreet Rating;
- B. Standard and Poor's Rating;
- C. Lines of credit;
- D. Evidence of a successful financial track record; and
- E. Evidence of adequate working capital.

#### 4.2.2.12 Certificate of Insurance (Submit under TAB K)

The Offeror shall provide a copy of its current certificate of insurance showing the types and limits of insurance in effect as of the Proposal submission date. The current insurance types and limits do not have to be the same as described in Section 3.12. See Section 3.12 for the required insurance certificate submission for the apparent awardee.

#### 4.2.2.13 Subcontractors (Submit under TAB L)

The Offeror shall provide a complete list of all subcontractors that will work on the Contract if the Offeror receives an award, including those utilized in meeting the MBE and/or VSBE subcontracting goal, if applicable. This list shall include a full description of the duties each subcontractor will perform and why/how each subcontractor was deemed the most qualified for this project. See Section 4.2.2.7 for additional Offeror requirements related to Subcontractors.

#### 4.2.2.14 Legal Action Summary (Submit under TAB M)

This summary shall include:

- A. A statement as to whether there are any outstanding legal actions or potential claims against the Offeror and a brief description of any action;
- B. A brief description of any settled or closed legal actions or claims against the Offeror over the past five (5) years;

- C. A description of any judgments against the Offeror within the past five (5) years, including the court, case name, complaint number, and a brief description of the final ruling or determination; and
- D. In instances where litigation is on-going and the Offeror has been directed not to disclose information by the court, provide the name of the judge and location of the court.

#### 4.2.3 Additional Required Technical Submissions (Submit under TAB O)

The following documents shall be completed, signed, and included in the Technical Proposal, under TAB O that follows the material submitted in response to Section 4.2.2.

For e-mail submissions, submit one (1) copy of each with original signatures. For paper submissions, submit two (2) copies of each with original signatures. All signatures must be clearly visible.

- A. Completed Bid/Proposal Affidavit (Attachment B).
- B. Completed Maryland Living Wage Requirements Affidavit of Agreement (Attachment G-1).
- C. Completed Conflict of Interest Affidavit and Disclosure (Attachment I).
- D. Completed Location of the Performance of Services Disclosure (Attachment N).
- E. Labor Classification Personnel Resume Summary (Attachment Q)
- F. Additional evidence and documents requested in Section 3.8.

### 4.3 Volume II – Financial Proposal

- 4.3.1 The Financial Proposal shall contain all price information in the format specified in Attachment F. **Offerors must prepare pricing for all toll free numbers.** The Offeror shall complete the Price Sheet only as provided in the Price Sheet Instructions and the Price Sheet itself. Offerors may not insert additional entries in the Price Sheet(s).
- 4.3.2 The Offeror may include a list of additional in-scope services with supplemental pricing as suggested offerings to the State. **These additional services will not be considered as part of the financial evaluation.** The service list and pricing submitted will become part of any resulting Contract, and the State may choose to add any or all of these additional services during the term of the Contract at the Contract Manager's sole discretion.
- 4.3.3 The State is exempt from federal excise taxes, Maryland sales and use taxes, District of Columbia sales taxes and transportation taxes. The Contractor; however, is not exempt from such sales and use taxes and may be liable for the same.

### 4.4 Proposal Packaging

- 4.4.1 **Packaging** - Volume I – Technical Proposal and Volume II – Financial Proposal shall be sealed separately from one another. It is preferred, but not required, that the name, e-mail address, and telephone number of the Offeror be included on the outside of the packaging for each volume. Each Volume shall contain an unbound original, so identified, and four (4) copies.

Unless the resulting package will be too unwieldy, the State's preference is for the two (2) sealed Volumes to be submitted together in a single package to the Procurement Officer prior to the date and time for receipt of Proposals and including a label bearing:

- a. The RFP title and number,
- b. Name and address of the Offeror, and
- c. Closing date and time for receipt of Proposals

- 4.4.2 **Technical Proposal Electronic Versions** - An electronic version of the Technical Proposal in Microsoft Word format (version 2007 or greater) must be enclosed with the original Technical Proposal. A second electronic version of Volume I in searchable Adobe .pdf format shall be submitted to support Public Information Act (PIA) requests. **Provide no pricing information on the media submitted in the Technical Proposal (Volume I). Include pricing information only in the Financial Proposal media (Volume II).**
- 4.4.3 **Financial Proposal Electronic Versions** - An electronic version of the Financial Proposal in Microsoft Excel format (version 2007 or greater) must be enclosed with the original Financial Proposal. A second electronic version of Volume II in searchable Adobe .pdf format shall be submitted to support Public Information Act (PIA) requests.
- 4.4.4 **Media Labeling** - Electronic media (CD, DVD, or flash drive) must be labeled on the outside with the RFP title and number, name of the Offeror, and volume number. Electronic media must be packaged with the original copy of the appropriate Proposal (Technical or Financial).
- 4.4.5 **Page Numbering** - All pages of both proposal volumes shall be consecutively numbered from beginning (Page 1) to end (Page "x").
- 4.4.6 **Page Size and Format** - A page is defined as each face of a sheet of paper containing information. When both sides of a sheet display printed material, it shall be counted as two pages. Page size shall be 8.5 x 11 inches, not including foldouts. Pages shall be single-spaced with single line spacing. Except for the reproduced sections of the solicitation document, the text size shall be no less than 12 points. Use at least 1/2" inch margins on the top and bottom and side margins. Pages shall be numbered sequentially by volume. These limitations shall apply to both electronic and hard copy proposals."

## 4.5 Proposal Delivery

- 4.5.1 Offerors may submit proposals by hand, or by mail as described below to the address provided in the Key Information Summary Sheet.
- A. For U.S. Postal Service deliveries, any Proposal that has been received at the appropriate mailroom, or typical place of mail receipt, for the respective procuring unit by the time and date listed in the RFP will be deemed to be timely. If an Offeror chooses to use the U.S. Postal Service for delivery, the Department recommends that it use Express Mail, Priority Mail, or Certified Mail only as these are the only forms for which both the date and time of receipt can be verified by the Department. An Offeror using first class mail will not be able to prove a timely delivery at the mailroom, and it could take several days for an item sent by first class mail to make its way by normal internal mail to the procuring unit.

- B. Hand-delivery includes delivery by commercial carrier acting as agent for the Offeror. For any type of direct (non-mail) delivery, Offerors are advised to secure a dated, signed, and time-stamped (or otherwise indicated) receipt of delivery.
- 4.5.2 The Procurement Officer must receive all Technical and Financial Proposal material by the RFP due date and time specified in the Key Information Summary Sheet. If submitted via e-mail, the date and time of submission is determined by the date and time of arrival in the Procurement Officer's e-mail box. Requests for extension of this date or time will not be granted. Except as provided in COMAR 21.05.03.02F, Proposals received by the Procurement Officer after the due date will not be considered.
- 4.5.1 After receipt, a Register of Proposals will be prepared that identifies each Offeror. The Register of Proposals will be open to inspection only after the Procurement Officer makes a determination recommending the award of the Contract.

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## 5 EVALUATION CRITERIA AND PROCEDURE

### 5.1 Evaluation Committee

Evaluation of Proposals will be performed in accordance with COMAR 21.05.03 by a committee established for that purpose and based on the evaluation criteria set forth below. The Evaluation Committee will review Proposals, participate in Offeror oral presentations and discussions, and provide input to the Procurement Officer. The Department reserves the right to utilize the services of individuals outside of the established Evaluation Committee for advice and assistance, as deemed appropriate.

### 5.2 Technical Proposal Evaluation Criteria

The criteria to be used to evaluate each Technical Proposal are listed below in descending order of importance. Unless stated otherwise, any sub-criteria within each criterion have equal weight.

#### 5.2.1 Offeror's Technical Response to RFP Requirements and Work Plan (See RFP § 4.2.2.6)

The Offeror's overall level of capability to provide Toll Free Services, as demonstrated by the quality of the Offeror's Technical Response to the requirements in Section 3 - the Scope of Work (excluding the Reporting Capabilities RFP § 3.9.2 - § 3.9.4). The State prefers a response that illustrates a comprehensive understanding of the RFP's work requirements and mastery of the subject matter, including an explanation of how the work will be performed. Proposals which include limited responses to work requirements such as "concur" or "will comply" will receive a lower ranking than those proposals that demonstrate an understanding of the work requirements and include plans to meet or exceed them.

#### 5.2.2 Offeror's overall reporting capabilities (See RFP § 3.9.2 - § 3.9.4). Capability will be determined by Offeror's ability to meet the reporting requirements outlined (See RFP § 3.9.2 - § 3.9.4), including the quality of the Offeror's sample Inventory Report. Quality will be determined by compliance with the requirements in Section 3.9.2. Failure to provide a sample report will result in a lower and/or unsatisfactory ranking.

#### 5.2.3 Offeror Qualifications and Capabilities, including proposed Subcontractors (See RFP § 4.2.2.8 – 4.4.2.14)

#### 5.2.4 Experience and Qualifications of Proposed Staff (See RFP § 4.2.2.7)

### 5.3 Financial Proposal Evaluation Criteria

#### 5.3.1 All Qualified Offerors (see Section 5.5.2.4) will be ranked from the lowest (most advantageous) to the highest (least advantageous) price based on the Total Evaluated Price within the stated guidelines set forth in this RFP and as submitted on Attachment F - Price Sheet.

### 5.4 Reciprocal Preference

#### 5.4.1 Although Maryland law does not authorize procuring agencies to favor resident Offerors in awarding procurement contracts, many other states do grant their resident businesses

preferences over Maryland contractors. COMAR 21.05.01.04 requires that procuring units apply a reciprocal preference under the following conditions:

- 5.4.1.1 The most advantageous offer is from a responsible Offeror whose headquarters, principal base of operations, or principal site that will primarily provide the products/services required under this RFP is in another state.
  - 5.4.1.2 The other state gives a preference to its resident businesses through law, policy, or practice; and
  - 5.4.1.3 The preference does not conflict with a Federal law or grant affecting the procurement Contract.
- 5.4.2 The preference given shall be identical to the preference that the other state, through law, policy, or practice gives to its resident businesses.

## **5.5 Selection Procedures**

### 5.5.1 General

- 5.5.1.1 The Contract will be awarded in accordance with the Competitive Sealed Proposals (CSP) method found at COMAR 21.05.03. The CSP method allows for the conducting of discussions and the revision of Proposals during these discussions. Therefore, the State may conduct discussions with all Offerors that have submitted Proposals that are determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for contract award or potentially so. However, the State reserves the right to make an award without holding discussions.
- 5.5.1.2 In either case (i.e., with or without discussions), the State may determine an Offeror to be not responsible and/or an Offeror's Proposal to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award at any time after the initial closing date for receipt of Proposals and prior to Contract award. If the State finds an Offeror to be not responsible and/or an Offeror's Technical Proposal to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award, that Offeror's Financial Proposal will be returned if the Financial Proposal is unopened at the time of the determination.

### 5.5.2 Selection Process Sequence

- 5.5.2.1 A determination is made that the MDOT Certified MBE Utilization and Fair Solicitation Affidavit (Attachment D-1A) is included and is properly completed, if there is a MBE goal. In addition, a determination is made that the Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) Utilization Affidavit and Subcontractor Participation Schedule (Attachment M-1) is included and is properly completed, if there is a VSBE goal.
- 5.5.2.2 Technical Proposals are evaluated for technical merit and ranked. During this review, oral presentations and discussions may be held. The purpose of such discussions will be to assure a full understanding of the State's requirements and the Offeror's ability to perform the services, as well as to facilitate arrival at a Contract that is most advantageous to the State. Offerors will be contacted by the State as soon as any discussions are scheduled.
- 5.5.2.3 Offerors must confirm in writing any substantive oral clarifications of, or changes in, their Technical Proposals made in the course of discussions. Any such written clarifications



or changes then become part of the Offeror's Technical Proposal. Technical Proposals are given a final review and ranked.

5.5.2.4 The Financial Proposal of each Qualified Offeror (a responsible Offeror determined to have submitted an acceptable Proposal) will be evaluated and ranked separately from the Technical evaluation. After a review of the Financial Proposals of Qualified Offerors, the Evaluation Committee or Procurement Officer may again conduct discussions to further evaluate the Offeror's entire Proposal.

5.5.2.5 When in the best interest of the State, the Procurement Officer may permit Qualified Offerors to revise their initial Proposals and submit, in writing, Best and Final Offers (BAFOs). The State may make an award without issuing a request for a BAFO. **Offerors may only perform limited substitutes of proposed personnel (see Section 1.23.E Substitution Prior to and Within 30 Days After Contract Execution).**

### 5.5.3 Award Determination

Upon completion of the Technical Proposal and Financial Proposal evaluations and rankings, each Offeror will receive an overall ranking. The Procurement Officer will recommend award of the Contract to the responsible Offeror that submitted the Proposal determined to be the most advantageous to the State. In making this most advantageous Proposal determination, technical factors will receive greater weight than financial factors.

## 5.6 Documents Required upon Notice of Recommended Award

Upon receipt of notice of recommended award, the following documents shall be completed, signed if applicable with original signatures, and submitted by the recommended awardee within five (5) Business Days, unless noted otherwise. Submit three (3) copies of each of the following documents:

- A. Contract (Attachment A),
- B. Contract Affidavit (Attachment C),
- C. Evidence of meeting insurance certificate requirements (See Section 3.10.4)

- 1.7. “eMM” means eMaryland Marketplace.

**2. Scope of Contract**

- 2.1. The Contractor shall provide statewide toll free services and related products as described in the RFP
- 2.2. These products and services shall be provided in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract and the following Exhibits, which are attached and incorporated herein by reference. If there are any inconsistencies between this Contract and Exhibits A through D, the terms of this Contract shall control. If there is any conflict among the exhibits, the following order of precedence shall determine the prevailing provision.

- 2.3 Except as otherwise provided, any reference to the Contract shall be deemed to include reference to a Purchase Order.

**3. Period of Performance**

- 3.1. The Contract shall start as of the date of full execution by the parties. From this date, the Contract shall be for a period of three (3) years beginning <<anticipated Contract start date>> and ending on <<anticipated end date of base term of Contract>>. In its sole discretion, the Department or Agency shall have the right to exercise an option to extend the Contract for two (2) one-year renewal periods.
- 3.2. The Contractor shall provide products and services under this Contract as of the date provided in a written Notice to Proceed.
- 3.3. Audit, confidentiality, document retention, patents, copyright, intellectual property, warranty and indemnification obligations under this Contract and any other obligations specifically identified shall survive expiration or termination of the Contract.

**4. Consideration and Payment**

- 4.1. In consideration of the satisfactory performance of the Contract, the Department or Agency shall promptly process a proper invoice for payment in accordance with the terms of this Contract.
- 4.2. The total payment for products and services provided under a fixed price contract or the fixed price element of a combined fixed price – time and materials contract, shall be the firm fixed price submitted by the Contractor in its Financial Proposal.
- 4.3. The Contractor shall submit invoices as required in the RFP. Each invoice must include the Contractor's Federal Tax Identification Number: <<enter the Contractor Tax ID number>>. In addition to any other available remedies, if, in the opinion of the Procurement Officer, the Contractor fails to perform in a satisfactory and timely manner, then Contractor will be notified and provided a time specified by the State to cure the breach. If the breach is not cured within the time specified within the notification, the Procurement Officer may refuse or limit approval of any invoice for payment, and may cause payments to the Contractor to be reduced or withheld until such time as the Contractor meets performance standards as established by the Procurement Officer.
- 4.5. Payment of an invoice by the Department or Agency is not evidence that services were rendered as required under this Contract.

**5. Patents, Copyrights, Intellectual Property**

The Contractor agrees that all documents and materials, including but not limited to, reports, drawings, studies, specifications, estimates, tests, maps, photographs, designs, software, graphics, mechanical, artwork, computations and data prepared by or for the Contractor for purposes of this Contract (Work Product) shall become and remain the sole and exclusive property of the State and shall be available to the Department or Agency at any time. The Department or Agency shall have the right to use the same without restriction and without compensation to the Contractor other than that specifically provided by

this Contract.

- 5.3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Contract, to the extent (i) the Work Product incorporates any Pre-Existing Intellectual Property or (ii) any Pre-Existing Intellectual Property (other than a computer's operating system, supported internet browser, browser accessibility software or hardware if needed by the user, and software required to access a commonly-available data transmission tool or export format) is required to access, install, build, compile or otherwise use the Work Product (such Pre-Existing Intellectual Property individually and collectively referred to herein as "Third-party Intellectual Property," which shall be the sole property of Contractor or its third-party licensors, as applicable), Contractor hereby grants to the State, on behalf of itself and any third-party licensors, a royalty-free, paid-up, non-exclusive, unrestricted, unconditional, irrevocable, worldwide right and license, with the right to use, execute, reproduce, display, perform, distribute copies of internally, modify and prepare derivative works based upon, such Third-party Intellectual Property as may be necessary for the State to use the Work Product for the purposes for which such Work Product was designed and intended. "Pre-Existing Intellectual Property" means any program, utility or tool owned by Contractor or its third-party licensors that was created by Contractor or its third-party licensors independently from its performance of this Contract and not solely using funds from this Contract.
- 5.4. Subject to the terms of Section 6, Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the State, including, but not limited to, the Department or Agency and its agents, officers, and employees, from and against any and all claims, costs, losses, damages, liabilities, judgments and expenses (including without limitation reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of or in connection with any claim the Work Product or any Third-party Intellectual Property infringes, misappropriates or otherwise violates any Third-party Intellectual Property rights. Contractor shall not enter into any settlement involving third party claims that contains any admission of or stipulation to any guilt, fault, liability or wrongdoing by the State or that adversely affects the State's rights or interests, without the State's prior written consent, which consent may be withheld in the State's sole and absolute discretion.
- 5.5. Contractor shall be entitled to control the defense or settlement of such claim (with counsel reasonably satisfactory to the State), provided that the State will, upon requesting indemnification hereunder: (a) provide reasonable cooperation to Contractor in connection with the defense or settlement of any such claim, at Contractor's expense; and (b) be entitled to participate in the defense of any such claim at its own expense. Except if Contractor has pre-existing knowledge of such infringement, Contractor's obligations under this section will not apply to the extent any Third-party Intellectual Property infringes, misappropriates or otherwise violates any third party intellectual rights as a result of modifications made by the State in violation of the license granted to the State pursuant to section 5.3; provided that such infringement, misappropriation or violation would not have occurred absent such modification.
- 5.6. Without limiting Contractor's obligations under Section 5.5, if all or any part of the Work Product or any Third Party Intellectual Property is held, or Contractor or the State reasonably determines that it could be held, to infringe, misappropriate or otherwise violate any third party intellectual property right, Contractor (after consultation with the State and at no cost to the State): (a) shall procure for the State the right to continue using the item or service in accordance with its rights under this Contract; (b) replace the item or service with an item that does not infringe, misappropriate or otherwise violate any third party intellectual property rights and, in the State's sole and absolute determination, complies with the item's specifications, and all rights of use and/or ownership set forth in this Contract; or (c) modify the item or service so that it no longer infringes, misappropriates or otherwise violates any third party intellectual property right and, in the State's sole and absolute determination, complies with the item's specifications and all rights of use and/or ownership set forth in this Contract.
- 5.7. Except for any Pre-Existing Intellectual Property and Third-Party Intellectual Property, Contractor shall not acquire any right, title or interest (including any intellectual property rights subsisting therein) in or to any goods, technical information, specifications, drawings, records, documentation, data or any other materials (including any derivative works thereof) provided by the State to the Contractor. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, the State may, in its sole and absolute discretion, grant

the Contractor a license to such materials, subject to the terms of a separate writing executed by the Contractor and an authorized representative of the State.

- 5.8. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, neither Contractor nor any of its subcontractors shall use any technology in a manner that will cause any patents, copyrights or other intellectual property which are owned or controlled by the State or any of its affiliates (or for which the State or any of its subcontractors has received license rights) to become subject to any encumbrance or terms and conditions of any third-party or open source license (including, without limitation, any open source license listed on <http://www.opensource.org/licenses/alphabetical>) (each an "Open Source License"). These restrictions, limitations, exclusions and conditions shall apply even if the State or any of its subcontractors becomes aware of or fails to act in a manner to address any violation or failure to comply therewith. No act by the State or any of its subcontractors that is undertaken under this Contract as to any technology shall be construed as intending to cause any patents, copyrights or other intellectual property that are owned or controlled by the State (or for which the State has received license rights) to become subject to any encumbrance or terms and conditions of any Open Source License.
- 5.9. The Contractor shall report to the Department or Agency, promptly and in written detail, each notice or claim of copyright infringement received by the Contractor with respect to all Work Product delivered under this Contract.

## **6. Indemnification**

- 6.1. Contractor shall indemnify, defend, and hold the State, its directors, officers, employees and agents harmless from liability for (a) tangible property damage, bodily injury and death, and (b) for the fraud or willful misconduct of Contractor, including all related defense costs and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of investigation, litigation, settlement, judgments, interest and penalties) arising from or relating to the performance of the Contractor or its subcontractors under this Contract.
- 6.2. The State has no obligation to provide legal counsel or defense to the Contractor or its subcontractors in the event that a suit, claim or action of any character is brought by any person not party to this Contract against the Contractor or its subcontractors as a result of or relating to the Contractor's obligations under this Contract.
- 6.3. The State has no obligation for the payment of any judgments or the settlement of any claims against the Contractor or its subcontractors as a result of or relating to the Contractor's obligations under this Contract.
- 6.4. The Contractor shall immediately notify the Procurement Officer of any claim or suit made or filed against the Contractor or its subcontractors regarding any matter resulting from or relating to the Contractor's obligations under the Contract, and will cooperate, assist, and consult with the State in the defense or investigation of any third party claim, suit, or action made or filed against the State as a result of or relating to the Contractor's performance under this Contract.
- 6.5. Section 6 shall survive expiration of this Contract.

## **7. Limitations of Liability**

- 7.1. Contractor shall be liable for any loss or damage to the State occasioned by the acts or omissions of Contractor, its subcontractors, agents or employees, including but not limited to personal injury; physical loss; or violations of the Patents, Copyrights, Intellectual Property sections of this Contract, as follows:
- 7.1.1. For infringement of patents, trademarks, trade secrets and copyrights as provided in Section 5 ("Patents, Copyrights, Intellectual Property") of this Contract;
- 7.1.2. Without limitation for damages for bodily injury (including death) and damage to real property and tangible personal property; and
- 7.1.3. For all other claims, damages, loss, costs, expenses, suits or actions in any way related to

this Contract where liability is not otherwise set forth as being “without limitation,” and regardless of the basis on which the claim is made, Contractor’s liability shall not exceed the value of the Contract. Third-party claims arising under Section 6 (“Indemnification”) of this Contract are included in this limitation of liability only if the State is immune from liability. Contractor’s liability for third-party claims arising under Section 6 of this Contract shall be unlimited if the State is not immune from liability for claims arising under Section 6.

7.1.4 In no event shall the existence of a subcontract operate to release or reduce the liability of Contractor hereunder. For purposes of this Contract, Contractor agrees that all Subcontractors shall be held to be agents of Contractor.

## **8. Prompt Pay Requirements**

8.1. If the Contractor withholds payment of an undisputed amount to its subcontractor, the State, at its option and in its sole discretion, may take one or more of the following actions:

(a) Not process further payments to the Contractor until payment to the subcontractor is verified;

(b) Suspend all or some of the Contract work without affecting the completion date(s) for the Contract work;

(c) Pay or cause payment of the undisputed amount to the subcontractor from monies otherwise due or that may become due to the Contractor;

(d) Place a payment for an undisputed amount in an interest-bearing escrow account;

(e) Default Contractor for failing to perform in accordance with the requirement to promptly pay subcontractors; or

(f) Take other or further actions as appropriate to resolve the withheld payment.

8.2. An “undisputed amount” means an amount owed by the Contractor to a subcontractor for which there is no good faith dispute. Such “undisputed amounts” include (a) retainage which had been withheld and is, by the terms of the agreement between the Contractor and subcontractor, due to be distributed to the subcontractor and (b) an amount withheld because of issues arising out of an agreement or occurrence unrelated to the agreement under which the amount is withheld.

8.3. An act, failure to act, or decision of a Procurement Officer or a representative of the Department or Agency concerning a withheld payment between the Contractor and subcontractor under this Contract, may not:

(a) Affect the rights of the contracting parties under any other provision of law;

(b) Be used as evidence on the merits of a dispute between the Department or Agency and the Contractor in any other proceeding; or

(c) Result in liability against or prejudice the rights of the Department or Agency.

8.4 The remedies enumerated above are in addition to those provided under COMAR 21.11.03.13 with respect to subcontractors that have contracted pursuant to the Minority Business Enterprise program.

## **9. Risk of Loss; Transfer of Title**

Risk of Loss and Transfer of Title do not apply to this Contract.

## **10. Source Code Escrow**

Source Code Escrow does not apply to this Contract.

## **11. Loss of Data**

The State will own all right, title and interest in its data that is related to the services provided under this



Contract. The Contractor and/or Subcontractor(s) shall not access public jurisdiction user accounts or public jurisdiction data, except (1) in the course of data center operations, (2) in response to service or technical issues, (3) as required by the express terms of this contract or (4) at the State's written request.

In the event of loss of any State data or records where such loss is due to the intentional act, omission, or negligence of the Contractor or any of its subcontractors or agents, the Contractor shall be responsible for recreating such lost data in the manner and on the schedule set by the Contract Manager. The Contractor shall ensure that all data is backed up and is recoverable by the Contractor. In accordance with prevailing federal or state law or regulations, the Contractor shall report the loss of non-public data as directed in Section 18.17.

## **12. Markings**

The Contractor shall not affix (or permit any third party to affix), without the Department's or Agency's consent, any restrictive markings upon any Work Product and if such markings are affixed, the Department or Agency shall have the right at any time to modify, remove, obliterate, or ignore such warnings.

## **13. Exclusive Use and Ownership**

Contractor shall not use, sell, sub-lease, assign, give, or otherwise transfer to any third party any other information or material provided to Contractor by the Department or Agency or developed by Contractor relating to the Contract, except that Contractor may provide said information to any of its officers, employees and subcontractors who Contractor requires to have said information for fulfillment of Contractor's obligations hereunder. Each officer, employee and/or subcontractor to whom any of the Department or Agency's confidential information is to be disclosed shall be advised by Contractor of and bound by the confidentiality and intellectual property terms of this Contract.

## **14. Notification of Legal Requests**

The Contractor shall contact the State upon receipt of any electronic discovery, litigation holds, discovery searches and expert testimonies related to the State's data under this Contract, or which in any way might reasonably require access to the data of the State, unless prohibited by law from providing such notice. The Contractor shall not respond to subpoenas, service of process and other legal requests related to the State without first notifying the State, unless prohibited by law from providing such notice.

## **15. Effect of Contractor Bankruptcy**

All rights and licenses granted by the Contractor under this Contract are and shall be deemed to be rights and licenses to "intellectual property," and the subject matter of this Contract, including services, is and shall be deemed to be "embodiments of intellectual property" for purposes of and as such terms are used and interpreted under § 365(n) of the United States Bankruptcy Code ("Code") (11 U.S.C. § 365(n) (2010)). The State has the right to exercise all rights and elections under the Code and all other applicable bankruptcy, insolvency and similar laws with respect to this Contract (including all executory statement of works). Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, if the Contractor or its estate becomes subject to any bankruptcy or similar proceeding: (a) subject to the State's rights of election, all rights and licenses granted to the State under this Contract shall continue subject to the respective terms and conditions of this Contract; and (b) the State shall be entitled to a complete duplicate of (or complete access to, as appropriate) all such intellectual property and embodiments of intellectual property, and the same, if not already in the State's possession, shall be promptly delivered to the State, unless the Contractor elects to and does in fact continue to perform all of its obligations under this Contract.

## **16. Confidentiality**

Subject to the Maryland Public Information Act and any other applicable laws, all confidential or proprietary information and documentation relating to either party (including without limitation, any information or data stored within the Contractor's computer systems) shall be held in absolute confidence by the other party. Each party shall, however, be permitted to disclose relevant confidential information to its officers, agents and employees to the extent that such disclosure is necessary for the performance of their

duties under this Contract, provided the data may be collected, used, disclosed, stored and disseminated only as provided by and consistent with the law. The provisions of this section shall not apply to information that (a) is lawfully in the public domain; (b) has been independently developed by the other party without violation of this Contract; (c) was already in the possession of such party; (d) was supplied to such party by a third party lawfully in possession thereof and legally permitted to further disclose the information; or (e) which such party is required to disclose by law.

**17. Parent Company Guarantee (If Applicable)**

Parent Company Guarantee does not apply to this Contract.

**OR**

[Corporate name of Parent Company] hereby guarantees absolutely the full, prompt and complete performance by "[Contractor]" of all the terms, conditions and obligations contained in this Contract, as it may be amended from time to time, including any and all exhibits that are now or may become incorporated hereunto, and other obligations of every nature and kind that now or may in the future arise out of or in connection with this Contract, including any and all financial commitments, obligations and liabilities. "[Corporate name of Parent Company]" may not transfer this absolute guaranty to any other person or entity without the prior express written approval of the State, which approval the State may grant, withhold, or qualify in its sole and absolute subjective discretion. "[Corporate name of Parent Company]" further agrees that if the State brings any claim, action, suit or proceeding against "[Contractor]", "[Corporate name of Parent Company]" may be named as a party, in its capacity as Absolute Guarantor.

**18. General Terms and Conditions**

Unless otherwise noted, the General Terms and Conditions are mandatory Contract Terms and will not be modified.

**18.1. Pre-Existing Regulations**

In accordance with the provisions of Section 11-206 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, the regulations set forth in Title 21 of the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR 21) in effect on the date of execution of this Contract are applicable to this Contract.

**18.2. Maryland Law Prevails**

This Contract shall be construed, interpreted, and enforced according to the laws of the State of Maryland. The Maryland Uniform Computer Information Transactions Act (Commercial Law Article, Title 22 of the Annotated Code of Maryland) does not apply to this Contract. Any and all references to the Annotated Code of Maryland contained in this Contract shall be construed to refer to such Code sections as from time to time amended.

**18.3. Multi-year Contracts contingent upon Appropriations**

If the General Assembly fails to appropriate funds or if funds are not otherwise made available for continued performance for any fiscal period of this Contract succeeding the first fiscal period, this Contract shall be canceled automatically as of the beginning of the fiscal year for which funds were not appropriated or otherwise made available; provided, however, that this will not affect either the State's rights or the Contractor's rights under any termination clause in this Contract. The effect of termination of the Contract hereunder will be to discharge both the Contractor and the State of Maryland from future performance of the Contract, but not from their rights and obligations existing at the time of termination. The Contractor shall be reimbursed for the reasonable value of any nonrecurring costs incurred but not amortized in the price of the Contract. The State shall notify the Contractor as soon as it has knowledge that funds may not be available for the continuation of this Contract for each succeeding fiscal period beyond the first.

**18.4. Cost and Price Certification**

- 18.4.1. The Contractor, by submitting cost or price information certifies that, to the best of its knowledge, the information submitted is accurate, complete, and current as of a mutually determined specified date prior to the conclusion of any price discussions or negotiations for:
- (1) A negotiated contract, if the total contract price is expected to exceed \$100,000, or a smaller amount set by the Procurement Officer; or
  - (2) A change order or contract modification, expected to exceed \$100,000, or a smaller amount set by the Procurement Officer.
- 18.4.2. The price under this Contract and any change order or modification hereunder, including profit or fee, shall be adjusted to exclude any significant price increases occurring because the Contractor furnished cost or price information which, as of the date agreed upon between the parties, was inaccurate, incomplete, or not current.

### **18.5. Contract Modifications**

The Procurement Officer may, at any time, by written order, make changes in the work within the general scope of the Contract. No other order, statement or conduct of the Procurement Officer or any other person shall be treated as a change or entitle the Contractor to an equitable adjustment under this section. Except as otherwise provided in this Contract, if any change under this section causes an increase or decrease in the Contractor's cost of, or the time required for, the performance of any part of the work, an equitable adjustment in the Contract price shall be made and the Contract modified in writing accordingly. Pursuant to COMAR 21.10.04, the Contractor must assert in writing its right to an adjustment under this section and shall include a written statement setting forth the nature and cost of such claim. No claim by the Contractor shall be allowed if asserted after final payment under this Contract. Failure to agree to an adjustment under this section shall be a dispute under Section 18.8, Disputes. Nothing in this section shall excuse the Contractor from proceeding with the Contract as changed.

### **18.6. Termination for Default**

If the Contractor fails to fulfill its obligations under this Contract properly and on time, or otherwise violates any provision of the Contract, the State may terminate the Contract by written notice to the Contractor. The notice shall specify the acts or omissions relied upon as cause for termination. All finished or unfinished work provided by the Contractor shall, at the State's option, become the State's property. The State of Maryland shall pay the Contractor fair and equitable compensation for satisfactory performance prior to receipt of notice of termination, less the amount of damages caused by the Contractor's breach. If the damages are more than the compensation payable to the Contractor, the Contractor will remain liable after termination and the State can affirmatively collect damages. Termination hereunder, including the termination of the rights and obligations of the parties, shall be governed by the provisions of COMAR 21.07.01.11B.

### **18.7. Termination for Convenience**

The performance of work under this Contract may be terminated by the State in accordance with this clause in whole, or from time to time in part, whenever the State shall determine that such termination is in the best interest of the State. The State will pay all reasonable costs associated with this Contract that the Contractor has incurred up to the date of termination, and all reasonable costs associated with termination of the Contract. However, the Contractor shall not be reimbursed for any anticipatory profits that have not been earned up to the date of termination. Termination hereunder, including the determination of the rights and obligations of the parties, shall be governed by the provisions of COMAR 21.07.01.12 (A)(2).

### **18.8. Disputes**

This Contract shall be subject to the provisions of Title 15, Subtitle 2, of the State Finance and

Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as from time to time amended, and COMAR 21.10 (Administrative and Civil Remedies). Pending resolution of a claim, the Contractor shall proceed diligently with the performance of the Contract in accordance with the Procurement Officer's decision. Unless a lesser period is provided by applicable statute, regulation, or the Contract, the Contractor must file a written notice of claim with the Procurement Officer within 30 days after the basis for the claim is known or should have been known, whichever is earlier. Contemporaneously with or within 30 days of the filing of a notice of claim, but no later than the date of final payment under the Contract, the Contractor must submit to the Procurement Officer its written claim containing the information specified in COMAR 21.10.04.02.

#### **18.9. Living Wage**

If a Contractor subject to the Living Wage law fails to submit all records required under COMAR 21.11.10.05 to the Commissioner of Labor and Industry at the Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation, the Department or Agency may withhold payment of any invoice or retainage. The Department or Agency may require certification from the Commissioner on a quarterly basis that such records were properly submitted.

#### **18.10. Non-Hiring of Employees**

No official or employee of the State of Maryland, as defined under General Provisions Article, §5-101, Annotated Code of Maryland, whose duties as such official or employee include matters relating to or affecting the subject matter of this Contract, shall during the pendency and term of this Contract and while serving as an official or employee of the State become or be an employee of the Contractor or any entity that is a subcontractor on this Contract.

#### **18.11. Nondiscrimination in Employment**

The Contractor agrees: (a) not to discriminate in any manner against an employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, creed, age, sex, marital status, national origin, sexual orientation, sexual identity, ancestry, or disability of a qualified person with a disability, sexual orientation, or any otherwise unlawful use of characteristics; (b) to include a provision similar to that contained in subsection (a), above, in any underlying subcontract except a subcontract for standard commercial supplies or raw materials; and (c) to post and to cause subcontractors to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the substance of this clause.

#### **18.12. Commercial Non-Discrimination**

- 18.12.1. As a condition of entering into this Contract, Contractor represents and warrants that it will comply with the State's Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy, as described under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland. As part of such compliance, Contractor may not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, age, marital status, sexual orientation, sexual identity, disability, or other unlawful forms of discrimination in the solicitation, selection, hiring, or commercial treatment of subcontractors, vendors, suppliers, or commercial customers, nor shall Contractor retaliate against any person for reporting instances of such discrimination. Contractor shall provide equal opportunity for subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers to participate in all of its public sector and private sector subcontracting and supply opportunities, provided that this clause does not prohibit or limit lawful efforts to remedy the effects of marketplace discrimination that have occurred or are occurring in the marketplace. Contractor understands that a material violation of this clause shall be considered a material breach of this Agreement and may result in termination of this Contract, disqualification of Contractor from participating in State contracts, or other sanctions. This clause is not enforceable by or for the benefit of, and creates no obligation to, any third party.

- 18.12.2. As a condition of entering into this Contract, upon the request of the Commission on Civil Rights, and only after the filing of a complaint against Contractor under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended from time to time, Contractor agrees to provide within 60 days after the request a complete list of the names of all subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers that Contractor has used in the past four (4) years on any of its contracts that were undertaken within the State of Maryland, including the total dollar amount paid by Contractor on each subcontract or supply contract. Contractor further agrees to cooperate in any investigation conducted by the State pursuant to the State's Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy as set forth under Title 19 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, and to provide any documents relevant to any investigation that are requested by the State. Contractor understands that violation of this clause is a material breach of this Contract and may result in Contract termination, disqualification by the State from participating in State contracts, and other sanctions.

**18.13. Subcontracting and Assignment**

The Contractor may not subcontract any portion of the products or services provided under this Contract without obtaining the prior written approval of the Procurement Officer, nor may the Contractor assign this Contract or any of its rights or obligations hereunder, without the prior written approval of the State, each at the State's sole and absolute discretion. Any such subcontract or assignment shall include the terms of this Contract and any other terms and conditions that the State deems necessary to protect its interests. The State shall not be responsible for the fulfillment of the Contractor's obligations to any subcontractors.

**18.14. Minority Business Enterprise Participation**

There is no Minority Business Enterprise subcontractor participation goal for this Contract.

**18.15. Insurance Requirements**

The Contractor shall maintain workers' compensation coverage, property and casualty and any other insurance as required in the RFP. The minimum limits of such policies must meet any minimum requirements established by law and the limits of insurance required by the RFP, and shall cover losses resulting from or arising out of Contractor action or inaction in the performance of services under the Contract by the Contractor, its agents, servants, employees or subcontractors. Effective no later than the date of execution of the Contract, and continuing for the duration of the Contract term, and any applicable renewal periods, the Contractor shall maintain such insurance coverage and shall report such insurance annually or upon Contract renewal, whichever is earlier, to the Procurement Officer. The Contractor is required to notify the Procurement Officer in writing, if policies are cancelled or not renewed 5 days of learning of such cancellation and/or nonrenewal. Certificates of insurance evidencing this coverage shall be provided within five (5) days of notice of recommended award. All insurance policies shall be issued by a company properly authorized to do business in the State of Maryland. The State shall be named as an additional insured on the property and casualty policy and as required in the RFP.

**18.16. Veteran Owned Small Business Enterprise Participation**

There is no VSBE subcontractor participation goal for this procurement.

**18.17. Security Requirements and Incident Response**

- 18.17.1. The Contractor agrees to abide by all applicable federal, State and local laws concerning information security and comply with current State and Department of Information Technology information security policy, currently found at <http://doit.maryland.gov/Publications/DoITSecurityPolicy.pdf>. Contractor shall limit access to and possession of Sensitive Data to only employees whose responsibilities reasonably

require such access or possession and shall train such employees on the Confidentiality obligations set forth herein.

- 18.17.2. The Contractor agrees to notify the Department or Agency when any Contractor system that may access, process, or store State data or Work Product is subject to unintended access or attack. Unintended access or attack includes compromise by a computer malware, malicious search engine, credential compromise or access by an individual or automated program due to a failure to secure a system or adhere to established security procedures.
- 18.17.3. The Contractor further agrees to notify the Department or Agency within twenty-four (24) hours of the discovery of the unintended access or attack by providing notice via written or electronic correspondence to the Contract Manager, Department or Agency chief information officer and Department or Agency chief information security officer.
- 18.17.4. The Contractor agrees to notify the Department or Agency within two (2) hours if there is a threat to Contractor's product as it pertains to the use, disclosure, and security of the State's data.
- 18.17.5. If an unauthorized use or disclosure of any Sensitive Data occurs, the Contractor must provide written notice to the Department or Agency within one (1) business day after Contractor's discovery of such use or disclosure and thereafter all information the State (or State Department or Agency) requests concerning such unauthorized use or disclosure.
- 18.17.6. The Contractor, within one day of discovery, shall report to the Department or Agency any improper or non-authorized use or disclosure of Sensitive Data. Contractor's report shall identify:
- (a) the nature of the unauthorized use or disclosure;
  - (b) the Sensitive Data used or disclosed,
  - (c) who made the unauthorized use or received the unauthorized disclosure;
  - (d) what the Contractor has done or shall do to mitigate any deleterious effect of the unauthorized use or disclosure; and
  - (e) what corrective action the Contractor has taken or shall take to prevent future similar unauthorized use or disclosure.
  - (f) The Contractor shall provide such other information, including a written report, as reasonably requested by the State.
- 18.17.7. The Contractor shall protect Sensitive Data according to a written security policy no less rigorous than that of the State, and shall supply a copy of such policy to the State for validation. The Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable laws that require the notification of individuals in the event of unauthorized release of Sensitive Data or other event requiring notification. In the event of a breach of any of the Contractor's security obligations or other event requiring notification under applicable law, the Contractor agrees to assume responsibility for informing all such individuals in accordance with applicable law and to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the State (or Department or Agency) and its officials and employees from and against any claims, damages, or other harm related to such security obligation breach or other event requiring the notification.
- 18.17.8. This Section shall survive expiration or termination of this Contract.

### **18.18. Suspension of Work**

The Procurement Officer unilaterally may order the Contractor in writing to suspend, delay, or interrupt all or any part of its performance for such period of time as the Procurement Officer may determine to be appropriate for the convenience of the State.

**18.19. Nonvisual Accessibility Warranty**

- 18.19.1. The Contractor warrants that the information technology to be provided under the Contract.
- (a) provides equivalent access for effective use by both visual and non-visual means;
  - (b) will present information, including prompts used for interactive communications, in formats intended for both visual and non-visual use;
  - (c) if intended for use in a network, can be integrated into networks for obtaining, retrieving, and disseminating information used by individuals who are not blind or visually impaired; and
  - (d) is available, whenever possible, without modification for compatibility with software and hardware for non-visual access.
- 18.19.2. The Contractor further warrants that the cost, if any, of modifying the information technology for compatibility with software and hardware used for non-visual access does not increase the cost of the information technology by more than five percent. For purposes of this Contract, the phrase "equivalent access" means the ability to receive, use and manipulate information and operate controls necessary to access and use information technology by non-visual means. Examples of equivalent access include keyboard controls used for input and synthesized speech, Braille, or other audible or tactile means used for output.

**18.20. Compliance with Laws/Arrearages**

The Contractor hereby represents and warrants that:

- 18.20.1 It is qualified to do business in the State of Maryland and that it will take such action as, from time to time hereafter, may be necessary to remain so qualified;
- 18.20.2 It is not in arrears with respect to the payment of any monies due and owing the State of Maryland, or any department or unit thereof, including but not limited to the payment of taxes and employee benefits, and that it shall not become so in arrears during the term of this Contract;
- 18.20.3 It shall comply with all federal, State and local laws, regulations, and ordinances applicable to its activities and obligations under this Contract; and,
- 18.20.4 It shall obtain, at its expense, all licenses, permits, insurance, and governmental approvals, if any, necessary to the performance of its obligations under this Contract.

**18.21. Contingent Fee Prohibition**

The Contractor warrants that it has not employed or retained any person, partnership, corporation, or other entity, other than a bona fide employee or bona fide agent working for the Contractor to solicit or secure this Contract, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any person, partnership, corporation or other entity, other than a bona fide employee or bona fide agent, any fee or other consideration contingent on the making of this Contract.

**18.22. Delays and Extensions of Time**

The Contractor agrees to perform this Contract continuously and diligently. No charges or claims for damages shall be made by the Contractor for any delays or hindrances from any cause whatsoever during the progress of any portion of the work specified in this Contract. Time extensions will be granted only for excusable delays that arise from unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor, including but not restricted to acts of God, acts of the public enemy, acts of the State in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, acts of another contractor in the performance of a contract with the State, fires, floods, epidemics,

quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, or delays of subcontractors or suppliers arising from unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of either the Contractor or the subcontractors or suppliers.

#### **18.23. Financial Disclosure**

The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of §13-221 of the State Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, which requires that every business that enters into contracts, leases, or other agreements with the State of Maryland or its agencies during a calendar year under which the business is to receive in the aggregate \$100,000 or more, shall, within 30 days of the time when the aggregate value of these contracts, leases or other agreements reaches \$100,000, file with the Secretary of State of Maryland certain specified information to include disclosure of beneficial ownership of the business.

#### **18.24. Political Contribution Disclosure**

The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of Md. - 18.25.1. The Contractor and Subcontractors shall retain and maintain all records and documents in any way relating to this Contract for three (3) years after final payment by the State under this Contract, or any applicable statute of limitations, prevailing federal or State law or regulation, or condition of award, whichever is longer, and shall make them available for inspection and audit by authorized representatives of the State, including the Procurement Officer or the Procurement Officer's designee, at all reasonable times. The Contractor shall, upon request by the Department or Agency, surrender all and every copy of documents needed by the State, including, but not limited to itemized billing documentation containing the dates, hours spent and work performed by the Contractor and its subcontractors under the Contract. The Contractor agrees to cooperate fully in any audit conducted by or on behalf of the State, including, by way of example only, making records and employees available as, where, and to the extent requested by the State and by assisting the auditors in reconciling any audit variances. Contractor shall not be compensated for providing any such cooperation and assistance. All records related in any way to the Contract are to be retained for the entire time provided under this section.
- 18.25.2 The State reserves the right, at its sole discretion and at any time, to perform an audit of the Contractor's and/or Subcontractors' performance under this Contract. In this Contract, an audit is defined as a planned and documented independent activity performed by qualified personnel, including but not limited to State and federal auditors, to determine by investigation, examination, or evaluation of objective evidence from data, statements, records, operations and performance practices (financial or otherwise) the Contractor's



and/or Subcontractor's compliance with the Contract, including but not limited to the adequacy and compliance with established procedures and internal controls over the services being performed for the State.

- 18.25.3 Upon three (3) business days' notice, Contractor and/or Subcontractors shall provide the State reasonable access during normal business hours to their records to verify conformance to the terms of this Contract. The State shall be permitted to conduct these audits with any or all of its own internal resources or by securing the services of a third party accounting/audit firm, solely at the State's election. The State shall have the right to copy, at its own expense, any record related to the services performed pursuant to this Contract.
- 18.25.4 Contractor and/or Subcontractors shall cooperate with the State or the designated auditor and shall provide the necessary assistance for the State or the designated auditor to conduct the audit.
- 18.25.5 The right to audit shall include subcontracts in which goods or services are subcontracted by Contractor and/or Subcontractors and that provide essential support to the services provided to the State under this Contract. Contractor and/or Subcontractors shall ensure the State has the right to audit with any lower tier Subcontractor.
- 18.25.2. This provision shall survive expiration of this Contract.

**18.26 Compliance with federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and State Confidentiality Law**

## Living Wage Requirements for Service Contracts

- A. This contract is subject to the Living Wage requirements under Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, Title 18, and the regulations proposed by the Commissioner of Labor and Industry (Commissioner). The Living Wage generally applies to a Contractor or Subcontractor who performs work on a State contract for services that is valued at \$100,000 or more. An employee is subject to the Living Wage if he/she is at least 18 years old or will turn 18 during the duration of the contract; works at least 13 consecutive weeks on the State Contract and spends at least one-half of the employee's time during any work week on the State Contract.
- B. The Living Wage Law does not apply to:
- (1) A Contractor who:
    - (a) Has a State contract for services valued at less than \$100,000, or
    - (b) Employs 10 or fewer employees and has a State contract for services valued at less than \$500,000.
  - (2) A Subcontractor who:
    - (a) Performs work on a State contract for services valued at less than \$100,000,
    - (b) Employs 10 or fewer employees and performs work on a State contract for services valued at less than \$500,000, or
    - (c) Performs work for a Contractor not covered by the Living Wage Law as defined in B(1)(b) above, or B(3) or C below.
  - (3) Service contracts for the following:
    - (a) Services with a Public Service Company;
    - (b) Services with a nonprofit organization;
    - (c) Services with an officer or other entity that is in the Executive Branch of the State government and is authorized by law to enter into a procurement ("Unit"); or
    - (d) Services between a Unit and a County or Baltimore City.
- C. If the Unit responsible for the State contract for services determines that application of the Living Wage would conflict with any applicable Federal program, the Living Wage does not apply to the contract or program.
- D. A Contractor must not split or subdivide a State contract for services, pay an employee through a third party, or treat an employee as an independent Contractor or assign work to employees to avoid the imposition of any of the requirements of Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, Title 18.
- E. Each Contractor/Subcontractor, subject to the Living Wage Law, shall post in a prominent and easily accessible place at the work site(s) of covered employees a notice of the Living Wage Rates, employee rights under the law, and the name, address, and telephone number of the Commissioner.
- F. The Commissioner shall adjust the wage rates by the annual average increase or decrease, if any, in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers for the Washington/Baltimore metropolitan

area, or any successor index, for the previous calendar year, not later than 90 days after the start of each fiscal year. The Commissioner shall publish any adjustments to the wage rates on the Division of Labor and Industry's website. An employer subject to the Living Wage Law must comply with the rate requirements during the initial term of the contract and all subsequent renewal periods, including any increases in the wage rate, required by the Commissioner, automatically upon the effective date of the revised wage rate.

G. A Contractor/Subcontractor who reduces the wages paid to an employee based on the employer's share of the health insurance premium, as provided in Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, §18-103(c), shall not lower an employee's wage rate below the minimum wage as set in Md. Code Ann., Labor and Employment Article, §3-413. A Contractor/Subcontractor who reduces the wages paid to an employee based on the employer's share of health insurance premium shall comply with any record reporting requirements established by the Commissioner.

H. A Contractor/Subcontractor may reduce the wage rates paid under Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, §18-103(a), by no more than 50 cents of the hourly cost of the employer's contribution to an employee's deferred compensation plan. A Contractor/Subcontractor who reduces the wages paid to an employee based on the employer's contribution to an employee's deferred compensation plan shall not lower the employee's wage rate below the minimum wage as set in Md. Code Ann., Labor and Employment Article, §3-413.

I. Under Md. Code Ann., State Finance and Procurement Article, Title 18, if the Commissioner determines that the Contractor/Subcontractor violated a provision of this title or regulations of the Commissioner, the Contractor/Subcontractor shall pay restitution to each affected employee, and the State may assess liquidated damages of \$20 per day for each employee paid less than the Living Wage.
